JAPS MURDERED SECTION BOSS
 [United Press Leased Wire.]
 Gilroy, Cal., April 7.—Residents of this section are up in arms today, following the revelation at the preliminary hearing of T. Yamashizu for the murder of Section Boss John Kyne, that the crime was the result of a conspiracy among 60 Japanese section hands.
 The crime was committed near this city last November, and Yamashizu, who is believed to have been the man who dealt the fatal blow to Kyne and the ringleader of the whole affair, was captured near Salt Lake several days ago. He was given a preliminary hearing here yesterday, and was held to answer to the superior court.
 Valuable testimony in the case was furnished by Victor Burnham, a graduate of the University of California, who was with the section crew at the time of the murder. He stated that the Japanese had been dissatisfied for some time, and that out of their feeling grew the plot to take the life of their chief.
 According to the testimony of Burnham, the crime was committed in a car which Kyne was preparing for the occupancy of the Japanese. While Kyne and Burnham, aided by two carpenters, were at work in the car, Yamashizu and another Jap named Torado, entered. The Japs were surly, and appeared to be looking for trouble. After a few words, Yamashizu seized a heavy hammer and his companion armed himself with an adze. Burnham and the carpenters were forced to the opposite end of the car by a score of Nipponese who had entered as if at a signal.
 During the general melee which followed, it is alleged that Yamashizu savagely attacked Kyne, beating his skull to a pulp with the heavy weapon. Kimaire, one of the carpenters, sustained severe cuts about the face and head, but succeeded in making his escape.
 Yamashizu claims that when he entered the car Kyne struck him with a board, and he returned the attack with the hammer. Other members of the crew, he states, rushed into the fray and dealt the blows resulting in Kyne's death. The following day the gang scattered, Yamashizu going to Salt Lake, where he was captured.

 Huntington, Or., April 7.—Death in flames that she watched approach without being able to escape on account of her paralyzed condition was the terrible fate met by Mrs. R. A. Lockett when her home in this city burned last night.
 Mrs. Lockett and a child of another family living in the house were alone when the fire started. The flames had gained great headway before the aged woman discovered them. Lying on her bed, absolutely unable to move, she screamed for help, realizing that if none came she must be burned alive. Slowly the fire crept to her, and her body was burned to a crisp. The child, sleeping in another part of the house, had been awakened by the roar of the flames just in time to save her own life.

 Upon the show-down it was seen that the winning hand was the four, five, six, seven and eight of hearts. The next was the three, four, five, six and seven of diamonds. The third was two, three, four, five and six of spades.
