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MR. SIMON FOR MAYOR OF PORTLAND.

The "advisory" convention at Portland has "suggested" the name of Hon. Jos. Simon for mayor of Portland.

If this suggestion is ratified at the Direct Primary, which must still be held, **HE WILL BE THE REGULAR NOMINEE.**

At that primary election other candidates may appear.

Mayor Lane has expressed a good sentiment in saying he does not want to get into that class.

RATIONAL EDUCATION IN MUSIC

That is sound and apparently practical advice which David Blipham offered with reference to teaching music in the public schools.

First, to learn singing in its simplicity, to become familiar with the tunes and songs that are close to the people and that develop the love of melody in the child's mind along the simplest lines.

Then, in the matter of instrumental music, to take advantage of the mechanical devices now in use, and thereby put before the more advanced pupil the best productions as performed by the greatest artists.

Following this again, to take a similar course with respect to high-class vocal music, using the phonograph as an aid by the selection of the finest singing records.

With all this there is the admonition to pay constant attention to the biography and the history of music, to develop a knowledge of the literary side of the art for the better

understanding of what music really does for the race.

It does not appear that these suggestions should be difficult to follow or that they would be otherwise than beneficial.

It is a proposed method of teaching that may run counter to tradition, and thereby may seem shocking to the professional musician, but this should be overcome in the one salient point of the new method, namely, its sureness of familiarizing the child mind with the best there is in music.

In this respect such method should widen the horizon of the pupils.

It should give to the study of music a new and abiding interest—a keener relish, in fact.—Portland Telegram

FOUR MEN KILLED IN MICHIGAN TORNADO

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Jackson, Mich., April 8.—Four men were killed at Aberdeen by the tornado that swept this part of the state Tuesday. The dead are: W. C. McMillan, president of the Aberdeen Bank; T. C. McMillan, a cotton buyer, and two negroes.

No other casualties have been reported.

According to the news which has reached this city, the storm was one of the most severe which the state has ever experienced. The greatest damage was done at Aberdeen, the county seat of Monroe county, where the four men lost their lives. Much property was demolished when the tornado swept through the city, and the station of the Illinois Central was razed to the ground.

Reports of damage done by the wind and rain in the smaller towns are coming in hourly.

THE KING OF SPAIN IN THE WRIGHT FLYING MACHINE.

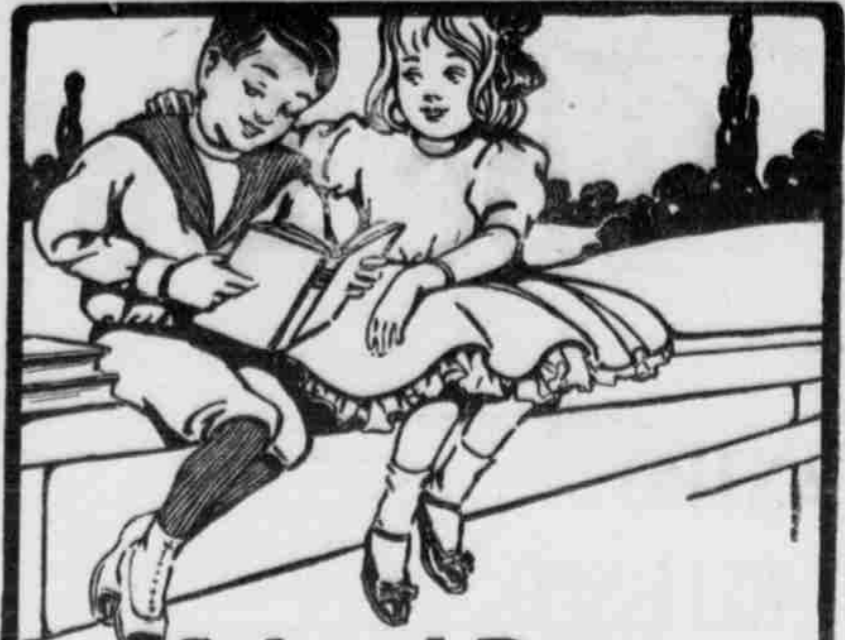

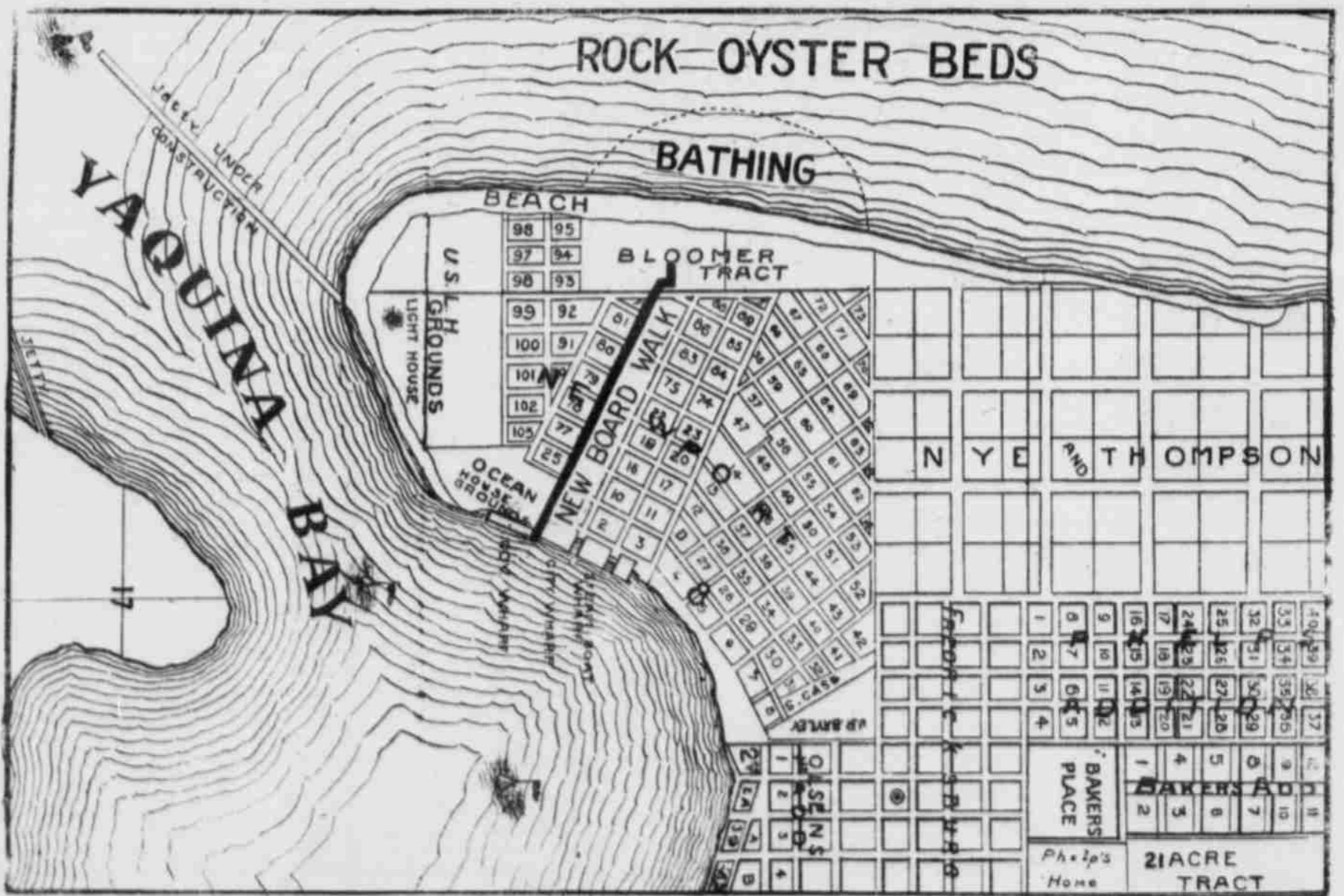
