**WANTED TO KEEP MEMORY OF HIS BABY**  
 James Travillion, who committed suicide at the asylum for the insane Tuesday night, had been an inmate of that institution for 18 years, though only 55 years old. A number of these many years he was confined to his bed. Of late years he had been a trusty, and had at no time shown any suicidal mania. It seems that for all these years he had thought his daughter dead, but a few days ago a letter was received from her inquiring about him and enclosing a picture of herself and husband, the letter being sent to the asylum authorities. When told this Travillion refused to look at the picture, saying he wanted now to go to his grave with the memory of his little child, as he had last seen her. While it is undoubtedly true that this incident decided him to make an end to his worries, it is no doubt true that he had contemplated suicide for some time, as among his little effects was found the following clipping:  
 "As to the general subject of suicide, a man is commonly the best judge of whether it is good for him. Suiicide is neither so trivial nor so alluring that it is likely to be undertaken in a spirit of thoughtless and airy levity, or without a serious canvass of its evils and advantages. The ancient, compared with whom we are babbling babes, held it in high esteem as a final defense against the assaults of fortune. We punish the unsuccessful attempt and load with calumny the name and memory of him who has put himself beyond the reach of our sage malevolence. For my part I would no more interfere with a person committing suicide than with a person engaged in being born.  
 It is to the clergy that we are mainly indebted for our brutality in this matter—the chaps who used to, and, I believe, still do deny the unfortunate suicide the invaluable advantage of burial in "consecrated ground," compelling his secret interment by night, with a cross above him and a stake to mark the spot. (True, the cross was no more than the intersection of two roads and the stake, having to be hammered well down, may have penetrated his inside, but it was the best that could be done). These enterprising gentlemen not only have "cornered" all the salable advantages and pleasures of life that their several syndicates can handle, but have laid their hands otherwise than in dedication upon life itself, and death, too. Everything enjoyable is to be enjoyed under conditions prescribed by them and—well, there is a small charge, of course. Naturally, they resent the escape of a customer."  
 He also left the following letter:  
 April 5.  
 My Dear Dr. Steiner.  
 This is the last act of a terrible tragedy. I have suffered a thousand deaths in the last three weeks. This is my own work, and no one is to blame but myself. There is no use for a coroner's inquest, as these facts bear witness. I don't want to meet my daughter, after mourning her as dead for 18 years. I want to die with her image in my heart as a darling little child.  
 Notify the county judge of Baker county. I have some land there which will go to my dear little child, Myrtle.  
 The letter was unsigned.  
 James Travillion was the brother of former County Judge Travillion, of Baker county, who was in office about 15 years ago.

**Family of Eleven Located.**  
 Charles E. Johnson, of Blamarek, N. D., bought the Joseph Cardos place on the corner of Twenty-second and Mill streets, through Hughes & Dennis. Mr. Johnson brings his wife and nine children. He says there are about fifteen families in his neighborhood who will come to Salem this summer. Mr. Johnson says it seemed to him that every winter in Dakota was colder than the one before, and he finally froze out. He went to Corvallis first but said that like most of the Germanic race he had always been accustomed to having a glass of beer when he felt like it, and did not like to live in "a dry town." He expects to buy a farm near Salem.
