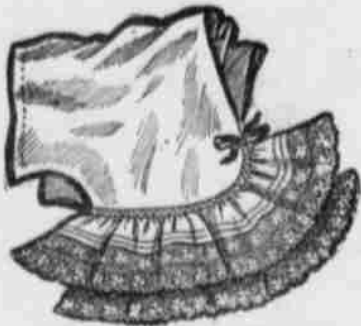

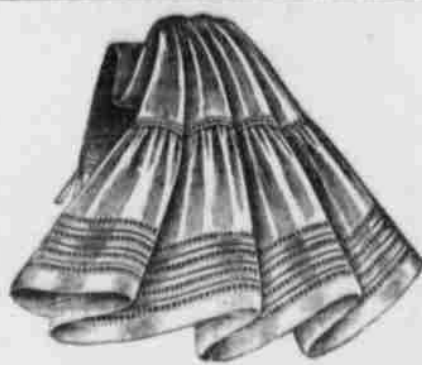

HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLAR HOSTELRY

Negotiations are pending for the erection of a modern hotel in this city to cost not less than \$100,000. An offer has been made of the old Willamette hotel property, for \$40,000 for the half block, buildings and

all. As a business enterprise that is a good investment, as business is moving south on Commercial street since the erection of a fine full-width bridge, and the decision of the property owners to pave south as far as Mission street. Business buildings will be going in on each side of the bridge. The Brown property just across the bridge on the east side of the street, has just been bought by H. Snook, the contractor, 300 feet front, and he at once informed the committee of South Salem rustlers that he would sign the paving petition as soon as he had his deed. This would not be a bad city for a hotel, and Mr. Snook may become interested in the game. The old Willamette property is valuable in the hands of progressive owners, who could put four stores in the first floor and a hotel above, and make it a paying property at once. Business property is next going to invade Perry street, as that street has paving petitions in and a street car line will be laid down it as fast as paved. Paving is going in on Perry street before it will on State between Commercial and Front, if the opposition on that block is not removed. The new hotel will be the finest advertisement the city can possibly have, and many are taking stock, and it may be named after a big stockholder.

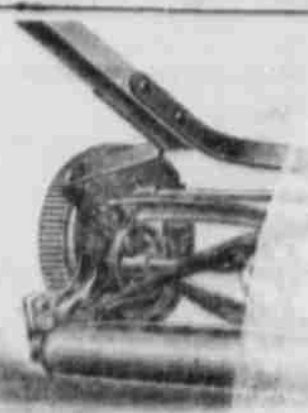
