

"MOTHER OF THE TEXAS REPUBLIC"

Fort Worth, Texas, April 10.—Arrangements for the funeral of Mrs. Fannie Van Zandt, the "mother of the Texas Republic," are being made today and although hundreds will pay tribute to her memory, none will wear mourning although all keenly feel her loss.

Mrs. Van Zandt, who was 95 years old, was the widow of the late Isaac Van Zant, who brought about the treaty which ratified the annexation of Texas with the United States. His wife greatly assisted him in fighting the opponents of annexation, and earned the affectionate title of "Mother of Texas."

She leaves 103 descendants, among them General G. M. Van Zandt, who has a notable war record.

The Railroad Commission has received from the Pacific Express Company another statement of rates on fruits or vegetables from Baker City, La Grande and Union, Oregon to points along the Missouri river. The statement was requested by the commission in order to ascertain the possibility of a reduction on rates covering vegetable and fruit shipments, which have been the source of much inquiry by the patrons of the company.

The Oregon Railroad & Navigation Company has answered the Railroad Commission's letter and a petition coming from residents of Montavilla enclosed, asking that the railroad company construct a passenger and freight station at that point. The company stated in its letter that only \$510.62 in revenues were realized from carload shipments to Montavilla annually, and that for this reason they did not think a station necessary.
