LEFT MONEY AS FRIEND AND MORE AS WIDOW
 [United Press Leased Wire.]
 Olympia, Wash., April 13.—Alfred Adler, of New York, who left an estate of \$250,000, provided in his will for a bequest of \$35,000 to his friend, Hannah Hartung, and then a few days before his death married her. She secured the \$35,000 as beneficiary, and drew her dower as widow under the New York laws.
 She, on the one side, and other heirs of Adler started a contest in the King county courts for the probate of the Washington estate.
 The supreme court, in a decision today, holds that she got the \$35,000 as a friend, not as a marriage settlement, that the will was not revoked as to the property in this state by her marriage, and orders the estate administered here according to the will.

ROBBED THE ROBBERS AND WAS KILLED
 [United Press Leased Wire.]
 Butte, Mont., April 13.—Because he "went broke" at a gaming table in the Mountain View saloon, Ed-ward Madden held up the resort in which 30 men were playing last night and robbed the bank of \$55.
 As Madden was making his escape through a secret exit, John Selsia, a bartender, emptied his revolver at Madden, fatally wounding him.
 On his deathbed Madden declared he got what was coming to him. He said that it looked so easy for the gamblers to rake in his money, that he determined to take a chance at the game himself.

UTAH TO HAVE UNIQUE BUILDING
 Seattle, Wash., April 13.—The contract for the erection of the Utah state building at the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition has just been let and work on the structure is to begin at once. Governor Spry, who has been in Seattle for several days, left for Salt Lake last evening. Walter E. Ward, architect, will remain to superintend construction.
 The Utah building will be unlike any other on the grounds.
 It will represent a style of architecture that was used by the Hopi Indians in Southern Utah, who flourished contemporaneously with the cliff dwellers. The exterior of the building will be plastered in imitation of adobe. Quaint old quartz and implements of the Pueblo Indians will be placed on the grounds, ground, and the whole will be in striking contrast to the classic and the renaissance types of structures elsewhere at the exposition.

SHOT BECAUSE HE FAILED TO CLOSE DOOR
 Spokane, Wash., April 13.—Under surveillance as a witness, W. H. Pahl, a surveyor, 24 years old, is lying in a hospital here today suffering from two bullet wounds inflicted by his brother, A. O. Pahl, a painter, whose anger was aroused by the wind blowing through an open door.
 Both men were in their home with their widowed mother yesterday when the painter asked his brother to close the door. The latter refused to do it, whereupon A. O. Pahl drew his revolver and fired two bullets in quick succession. One struck his brother's jaw, passing through his cheek, and the other clipped off the end of one thumb. The enraged man was reloading his revolver when his aged mother seized his hand. He was taken by the police, and the wounded man was rushed to a hospital, where, it is said, he will recover.
