WANTS NAME OFF PETITION

As the result of the County Commissioners ordering a survey made of a new proposed county road in the district of Broadacres, a petition has been filed with the County Clerk by M. C. Brennan asking the Commissioners to strike his name off the former petition presented to the body for the erection of the new highway. The petition filed by Mr. Brennan alleges that his name was procured by the circulation of the paper by fraudulent means and that he was induced to partake of spirituous drink prior to the signing of the petition. Further petition was also filed asking the Commissioners to give compensation in the sum of \$1,095 as damages that would be incurred if the new road way should be actually built through a section of his property. The Commissioners will probably take the matter up at the next meeting.
