WOMAN POLICE DO GOOD WORK
 [United Press Leased Wire.]
 San Francisco, Cal., April 15.—Mystery surrounds the identity of a woman who lies in the St. Thomas hospital in this city suffering with a broken neck. While the physicians in charge of the unusual case are constant in their refusals to disclose her name, it is understood that she is a woman of wealth and high social position.

It is known that the patient was taken to the hospital a week ago. A day later she was followed by an assortment of trunks and boxes, making it apparent that she had come to stay for an indefinite time. Every precaution to prevent her identity or the nature of the accident which resulted in the broken neck has been taken by the physicians and the hospital attendants. Drs. E. G. Frisbie and Harry M. Sherman are the surgeons who have charge of the strange case, and who will perform the delicate operation that is hoped will restore the mysterious patient to health. Both men are reticent regarding their charge. In speaking of her, Dr. Frisbie said: "The woman is of a sensitive and refined nature, and I am sure would not want her misfortune made public. We must respect her wishes now, and await her permission to give out news of any interest evolving from the case."

The case of the mysterious patient at the St. Thomas is one of 14 or 15 cases in the medical history of the nation. The recent case of Mrs. William C. Whitney, of New York, created national attention.

FRANKLIN COULD NOT MAKE GOOD

 Portland Or., April 15.—The failure of Charles Franklin, the Seattle wrestler, to make good his boast that he could throw any six Oregon mat artists within 90 minutes of actual wrestling has not endeared him to the hearts of the local sports.
 Joe Carroll, his manager, posted \$250 to be forfeited if Franklin could not perform the feat. Only two men showed up last night to oppose the Seattle wrestler. They were John Berg and Bert Thomas. Franklin felt his popularity waning the very first bout in which Thomas was pitted against him. Thomas threw the Seattle wonder at the end of 40 minutes. Then followed Berg but the crowd had lost interest in wrestling for the present.

STRIPED BASS FOR LOWER COLUMBIA
 [United Press Leased Wire.]
 Portland, Or., April 15.—Five hundred striped bass are to be planted in the lower Columbia river through the efforts of United States Senator Bourne and F. V. Holman, of Portland.
 The salmon interests, it has been learned, will offer no objection to this move, as the striped variety of bass do not swim out of salt or brackish water.
 Senator Bourne, who is chairman of the senate fisheries committee, has expressed his willingness to endorse an application for 500 young bass. It is expected that this application will be promptly granted by the department of fisheries. Striped bass in large quantities are now being caught in the Sacramento river, where 160 were planted only a few years ago by the fisheries department. This fish grows to a weight of 15 to 20 pounds.
