## ST. JOHNS WANTS PAINT FACTORY TRYING TO LOCATE THE OREGON SIENNA WORKS DOWN ON PENINSULA

An article in The Capital Journal last Saturday had some timely remarks on the duty of supporting home industries. It showed in a very practical way how we could build up Salem enterprises that are already in existence by supporting them and giving them the preference. This city has lost good home industries by not giving them any support whatever, and it seems foolish to try to bring in new enterprises, when we fail by individual and collective effort to sustain those already in existence in our midst.

**Wants Paint Factory.**  
The Capital Journal recalls the organized labor that was bestowed on

securing the Oregon Sienna Paint industry for this city. That was only a few years ago, but it has grown into a large and successful business, with a branch establishment at Portland. Now a committee is here at Salem from St. Johns to try and secure the paint factory for that live city down on the peninsula. They were sent up by the St. John's Commercial Club, which is figuring on how to get the paint factory moved down there. A delegation was sent over the plant, and then went on to see the paint mine in Lane county. They seemed to be favorably impressed, and will make their report to the St. John's

Commercial Club next Thursday evening.

### Requires More Capital.

Mr. Weyant, local manager, was seen today by a Journal reporter and admitted that negotiations were pending with the town down the river, but declined to say what they were intending to do. He said he would regret to leave Salem, but their business had grown so they needed more capital to operate with. Their mills were grinding to their full capacity, and they could sell all they could turn out, and had to enlarge by doubling or tripling their output. New capital would have to be enlisted, as the demand for the paint was growing daily, and the rest of the treasury stock would have to be sold to meet the demand for bigger orders, and prevent loss of trade on account of inability to fill orders.

### MODEL PIECE OF CONSTRUCTION

The South Commercial Street Street Bridge Is Completed and Turned Over to the City in Good Shape.

The finishing touches have been put on the South Commercial street bridge today. The Spaulding Lumber Co. finished the walk next to the company's barn, which was really on a street, and the city should have done it. Not required by the specifications, the contractors have put in a filler next to the rails of the street car track, so that buggy wheels will not be caught. They have also bored every pile near the ground and put in carbolineum or wood preservative, not required by the specifications. They also applied carbolineum at every joint and place where wood comes upon wood, and have altogether done a first-class job. The lines of the whole bridge are as true as those of a billiard table. The city engineering department and the bridge committee put in a great deal of time and extra attention on this bridge, to secure a first-class job, and the bridge is one of the most creditable appearing pieces of work ever performed in this city. Pugh & Herren deserve credit for doing a model job for the city, and it is very much appreciated. The bridge committee will next recommend a new bridge for Bush street.
