OREGON IS AWAKE TO HER NEEDS AND WILL HELP HERSELF

DEVELOPMENT LEAGUES BUSY--AN ERA OF RAILROAD BUILDING, WILL FOLLOW THE LEAGUE WORK--THE JOURNAL'S "1000 FACTS" PRONOUNCED THE BEST PIECE OF ADVERTISING EVER ISSUED IN OREGON

The Board of Governors of the Salem Board of Trade has adopted a new policy in its advertising policies. In making up its budget for 1909 the board has set aside enough of its ten thousand dollar publicity funds to send a copy of The Saturday Journal to every person who writes to the Salem Board of Trade for information about the Capital City, and there will be no more literature sent out for any real estate firms as has been the custom the past year. The board has decided on this as a good proposition for the board and for the city of Salem. Every real estate man advertises in this newspaper more or less and if he knows that every person who writes to the Board of Trade during the week will get a copy of the Saturday Journal tells him that his advertisement is going to the intending homeseeker who may be brought this way. Besides The Salem Journal tells of great many other fine things that are being done at Salem, and in all this part of the state. This progressive policy on the part of the City Board of Trade will help advertise the city on the right lines by showing those who write here that our city has live newspapers as well as a live Board of Trade, and the two together form a strong combination.

Mr. L. Zielke, who left Salem a few years ago and went back to Kansas, has returned and bought the James Penland cottage in South Salem. Mr. Zielke and family are happy to be back in Oregon. Mrs. Zielke was quite homesick for Oregon and cried tears whenever she thought of the mild weather there was here compared to the hard winter which they were suffering there and she was never content until Mr. Zielke had packed up and returned toward the West. The family was perfectly happy on their arrival and the children went out and rolled in the grass and one of them could not be kept from pulling up and eating a handful of the green, it seemed so tender and delicious. Mrs. Zielke is as happy as a bride on being back in the land of Webfoot, and no amount of money could tempt them to leave this country. Here they will live and here they will die, is the motto of the Zielkes.

A California man was in The Journal office the other day and was talking over the prospects of immigration. He said this coast was slated for the biggest tourist traffic in the history of the country. More people were headed for the Pacific Coast than ever before, and the beauty of it is they are headed for Oregon. He told of one county in Ohio where he happened to be well acquainted, where he said three thousand people were packing up to come to Oregon. Of the three thousand, two thousand were coming to Salem. At first we thought the man was trying to sell us some life insurance or a patent right, but that was not the case and he seemed to be sober and in his right mind. Three thousand people from one county and two thousand of those coming to Salem. This is enough to interest the oldest inhabitant. The immigration business is not going to be overdone, the way the people scatter after they arrive and go into the country. The country is building up as fast as the city, and this city is growing faster than any city in the state for its size. It is growing away faster than Portland, compared to the size of Portland, and in turn many people go to Portland after they have been here for awhile.

A new edition of Twenty Thousand Facts of Production has been published for the Salem Board of Trade. The statement of Tom Richardson at the Salem booster meeting that this was the best piece of advertising literature ever sent out of Oregon, and

that he knew personally of its bringing more than one thousand people to the Willamette valley, has been backed up by a strong letter written by William McMurray of the Harriman lines, paying a high tribute to the One Thousand Facts as advertising of the highest value. The Salem School children have sent out fifteen hundred copies of One Thousand Facts the past week with letters written to their friends in the East. A copy of this sheet should be sent out to every person who writes for information about Salem and the Willamette Valley.

There are two Development Conventions programmed to be held this month in Eastern Oregon and Western Idaho. At La Grande, April 27-28, there will be two days put in boosting the wonderful Grande Ronde valley of Union County, with one day at Irrigation, and among the Speakers Hon. C. N. McArthur will make his first public appearance as a booster, taking the theme "A Greater Oregon." Hon. Willis Dunaway will give the experiences of a business man at Irrigation at the La Grande meeting. Col. C. E. S. Wood will discuss the railroad situation, and the Transportation Committee of the Portland Chamber of Commerce will be represented with a speaker at La Grande will have charge of the congress of boosters, and many of the best men of Eastern Oregon will appear there. An immense irrigation project is pretty well under way and that city is thriving.

At Weiser, Idaho, the Development Congress will be held April 30 May 1st, with a little bending of the Sabbath day by way of an excursion into Northern Idaho on Sunday. That will be over the P. & N. Railroad, call facetiously the Pin railroad in that country and at the head of which stands one of the biggest men in Southern Idaho—Hon. Edgar M. Heigho, who has built railroads out of the most unpromising materials. He is a strong advocate of the Idaho district railroad law, which takes a territory and creates it into a district, then proceeds to build a railroad at the expense of the property in the district and for the benefit of the district, just as the district would build an irrigating ditch. The district owns the railroad and leases it to some big system, but always keeping hold of the property. The lands are increased in value ten times as much as the road costs, and the whole thing works out beautifully. The Oregonian's talk about bankrupting the state building and operating railroads has no application, because the district owns it and has done it from supremely selfish motives, and makes big money by doing it. The Idaho people have hit on a big principle in that new law of theirs and so will Oregon if we follow suit.

The biggest Booster Convention will be held down at Burns, Harney County, July 1-2. The 3d will fall on Saturday and that will be observed as the Fourth of July in that country and people will come together for 150 miles around. Judge Stephen A. Lowell has agreed to be present, and then take a trip with the party across Lake Crook and Klamath counties. It will be a fine time of the year to cross the great Oregon desert. Those who have never visited the great unexplored interior of Oregon have a treat in store for themselves. The Development Campaign will then be extended clear across central Oregon, and will wind up with a big booster convention on Coos Bay in August, and

Harriman in setting aside two million dollars for the construction of his line into Tillamook, and the sudden decision to build up the Des Chutes river into Central Oregon shows that he is feeling the impulse of the development conventions and will come through for his share of the work of upbuilding Oregon just as fast as the people awaken to the possibilities of their own state and its peerless resources.
