## DOG AND PONY SHOW NOW FULL-FLEDGED CIRCUS

Since bicyclists first gained their wonderful vogue, great interest has been evinced at the number and variety of tricks that could be accomplished upon the wheels. Each troupe of expert cyclists try to outdo the other in hazardous accomplishments and many are the difficult tricks performed upon the whirling wheels, but it remained for the Valdons, a troupe of seven young men and women dare devils, to invent all the new feats of a sensational nature.
