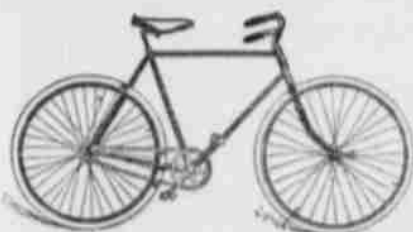

ONE OF SEATTLE'S FOUR HUNDRED WILL BE HALED INTO A POLICE COURT FOR EXCEEDING AUTOMOBILE SPEED LIMIT

Tacoma, April 23.—The Tacoma police have issued warrants for the arrest of C. W. Huotari of Aberdeen, Mrs. Chancery A. Wright of Seattle and Mrs. Mary Keller of Puyallup, each charged with exceeding the automobile speed limit on Pacific avenue Wednesday afternoon at a rate greatly in excess of 10 miles an hour, the limit. The others were on Pacific avenue Monday.

THOMAS DEFENDED PROPERTY

Against Depredations by Band of Lawless Greeks Who Stole Chickens.

Constable Ira Hamilton made a trip to Gates yesterday and arrested Charley Thomas on the charge of shooting at a band of Greek workmen who were employed by the railroad company. When Thomas was brought before Justice of the Peace Webster this morning for hearing, he denied he was guilty of the shooting. The case is set for trial next Friday, and Thomas placed under \$250 bonds. No bonds were given and the defendant was locked up in the county jail until time for trial. It appears as though Thomas has had considerable trouble with foreign workmen along the railroad which passes close to his farm, and Thomas states many depredations have been committed against his property, such as chicken stealing and other petty offenses. The Greeks will be brought into court next Friday, and explain the matter, and it is probable a complaint will be filed against them in the future.

TWO NEW SUITS IN CIRCUIT COURT

The circuit court, one by Roy Stiffler and one by E. L. Rowland against H. P. Minto, sheriff, asking the court to render judgment in which a horse valued at \$150 he returned to the plaintiffs by Sheriff Minto, who took possession of the animal as attached property. The present suit is derived from the action for money case of W. A. Irvin vs. Roy Stiffler and E. L. Rowland for recovery of money on a promissory note, and along with the complaint filed by Irvin, there was an attachment on the property of the defendants. The plaintiffs in the present suit state that the sheriff has no right to take the property in question and that damages in the sum of \$25 has been incurred as the result of depriving them of the horse, which was used to deliver sewing machines. Frank Holmes appears for the plaintiffs.

STEWART DIES OF OPERATION

Morris Stewart, former Senator from Nevada, died this morning at the Georgetown Hospital. A fortnight ago he underwent an operation for enlarged glands. The operation was apparently successful, but Wednesday he suffered a relapse.

Senator Stewart was born at Lyons, New York, August 9, 1827. He entered Yale college, but before completing his course was attracted by the gold discoveries in California. He arrived in San Francisco in May, 1850.

AUDITING CLERK HAS TO DIG UP

Through an error, the legislature failed to appropriate enough money by 73 cents to cover the deficiency of the salaries of the circuit judges and interest thereon. Auditing Clerk Corey has, therefore, been compelled to make up this additional deficiency out of his own pocket.

DIVORCE SUIT AND A MINOR CHILD

A complaint for divorce has been filed in the circuit court by Viola E. Morris against William R. Morris. In the complaint Mrs. Morris alleges her husband treated her in a cruel manner, and threatened her life many times when he became intoxicated. One minor child is also asked for by the plaintiff. Attorney F. A. Turner is appearing in the case for the plaintiff.

ANOTHER PUGILIST ANXIOUS TO GET AT JACK JOHNSON

MAXIMUM PENALTY GIVEN MAN FOR KILLING PUPPY

San Francisco, April 23.—Walter F. Cooks, retired capitalist, today was held in custody under \$100 bond because he shot and killed a 19-month-old puppy belonging to a neighbor.

The charge which has been preferred against him is cruelty to animals, and, according to Judge Shortall, he may be given the maximum penalty for his offense, six months in jail.

When Cook's case was called for hearing this morning witnesses testified that the defendant deliberately shot the puppy because it ran into his yard and barked at him. He justified his action on the ground that he was upon his own property when he fired the shot, and that the pup had barked at him many times before. Judge Shortall, who is known locally as a dog fancier in giving his decision said:

"I find you guilty, and order you into custody for sentence tomorrow. Bond is raised to \$1000, and, unless I change my mind, you won't escape punishment by paying a fine. A jail sentence is too good for a brute of your type."

The puppy belonged to Mrs. Kathleen O'Neill. According to witnesses it was barking at Cooks in a spirit of play when it was killed.
