NURSERIES TELL STORY OF OREGON'S GREAT ORCHARDS

In Spite of Great Stocks Demand for Young Fruit Trees Drive Oregon Nurseries to Utmost Limit to Meet Orders—Walnuts a Great Favorite.

There is perhaps no better criterion of the orchard business than the nurseries, for they show what is being done in the way of increasing the orchards. The Oregon Nursery is doing a big business, though just at present its representatives were not here. In order to get in touch with the nursery business a Journal reporter has been interviewing those employed in Salem's nurseries. The consensus of opinion seems to be that the orchard business has not increased by percentages but has gone by leaps and bounds, away beyond anything ever heard of before, and so far beyond the ideas of the nursery men themselves that they are pushed to the utmost limits to fill orders.

The January weather did some damage to young nursery stock, but it was only trifling and that to the tender yearling sprouts. At the same

time the season has not been propitious, the dry weather preventing the handling of nursery stock along usual lines.

At the same time the demand for nursery stock has been unprecedented, the principal demand being for apples and cherries, and at the Marion County Nursery the demands have made them, with all their great stock, sit up at nights to fill orders. One peculiarity of the situation is the big demand for English walnuts. A demand so incisive that while applicants want some special brand, they, one and all, say, "If you can't give us those, give us walnuts of any good kind."

All this shows how the Willamette valley is waking up to the orchard idea and also showing the trend of planting. It is mostly apples and walnuts, but the cherries come in all the time as a favorite, for in Marion county cherries are indigenous.

OREGON ELECTRIC GAINING BUSINESS

The freight business now being carried on by the Oregon Electric between here and Portland has just about doubled, according to statements made by the officials today. Every day the local freight leaves this city with a full carload and the incoming cars are also laden with goods for Salem business houses. There has been some intention on the part of the company to make further improvements in their passenger service. A later night train is now talked of and two more additional cars during the day service. More cars will probably be placed on the Forest Grove line also.

Bought Home in Salem—Wm. McLaughlin of Albany has bought a house and lot in this city, and after disposing of his property in Albany will come to Salem with his family to make his home. Mr. McLaughlin has been camp foreman for the Spaulding Logging Company for the past 20 years and has many friends in this city.

Salem-Dallas Railroad—L. Gerlinger of Dallas was over Tuesday conferring with S. S. Hunt of the Spaulding Logging Company regarding the delivery of the bridge material for the Salem, Falls City and Western railroad which is now under construction. The Spaulding people have delivered material on the ground for the construction of one bridge and are prepared to furnish the balance for the other structures at any time. Mr. Gerlinger is manager of the Salem, Falls City road and states progress has been excellent on the new road.
