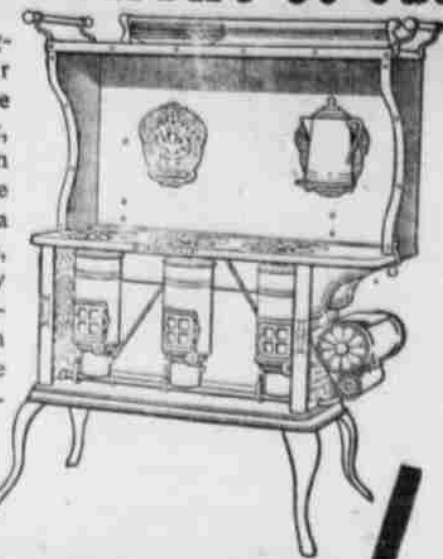

SALEM SHOWS GROWTH THAT IS PHENOMENAL

Expenditures for Improvements This Year Will Reach Over a Million and a Half, Besides a Million for Mountain Water.

Salem—Special to Oregonian. From present indications, over \$1,500,000 will be disbursed in Salem this year in building operations. Last year 336 new houses were built in the city, and from reliable reports the number of these will reach 600 this season. At an average cost of \$600, which is considered conservative, there will be \$1,000,000 disbursed for building new homes, not including thousands of dollars that will be expended in remodeling old houses.

Some time this week articles of incorporation will be filed by a local hotel association and active work will be under way shortly on a new hotel to cost upward of \$1,000,000. Work will be started in a few days on a new school building to cost \$30,000. Eaton hall, the finest building on the campus at Willamette University, is nearing completion, and when ready to turn over to the corporation will have cost the donor, A. E. Eaton, of Union, Or., about \$50,000. Unfinished building work at the state home for the feeble minded will call for the expenditure of \$50,000 this summer. The deaf mute school will be given a new location closer to the city, and \$40,000 has been appropriated for new buildings. Physician's cottages and other buildings at the state insane asylum will call for the expenditure of from \$100,000 to \$200,000 this season.

Judge P. H. D'Arcy will commence work at once on a \$30,000 business block on Court street. The Salem Fruit Union will close a contract in a few days for a \$50,000 warehouse. The Southern Pacific has definitely promised to spend several thousands

for new depots and other improvements at this point. The United States National Bank will build a five-story steel structure on the corner of State and Commercial streets. The Knights of Pythias have purchased a centrally located lot and are planning to construct an expensive lodge house. The German Society expects to construct a club-house with gymnasium and theatre. The Salem Canoe Club has started an active campaign for a new clubhouse on the river front, with tennis courts and facilities for other outdoor games.

A bill passed by the recent regular session of the legislature carries an appropriation of \$20,000 for the erection of a building for the treatment of tuberculosis patients, but these buildings may not go up until next year. Twenty-five thousand dollars has been appropriated for new buildings and improvements at the state fair grounds. John McNary and Walter Stolz will build a brick business block at the corner of Court and Liberty. Eugene Eckert plans a \$25,000 three-story brick on Liberty. A branch fire station has just been completed in East Salem, giving the Capital City three stations. Approximately two miles of hard-surface paving will be laid during the summer and fall.

A large number of building ventures are now being considered, but have not yet reached a definite stage of development. In the past two years real estate values have more than doubled, new people are constantly arriving, and Salem business men are looking forward to the greatest year in the history of the city.
