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## ROBBERS HOLD UP TRAIN NEAR SPOKANE

[United Press Leased Wire.]

Spokane, Wash., April 30.—Armed sheriffs and their deputies for miles around today are engaged in a systematic search for the two desperate bandits who late last night held up a Northern Pacific train, cut the engine and mail car from the rest of the train, ran them down the track and looted the car. They lugged a large quantity of mail with them, but the value of it is unknown.

The robbers did not attempt to molest the passengers in any way. Boarding the train three miles east of Houser Junction, Idaho, they cut the mail car and engine from the train, and one of them fired a shot at the fireman, who slipped from the cab and disappeared.

With a revolver held at his head, Engineer Whitley ran the engine at top speed, and when it and the mail car passed through Hauser, one of the robbers was pitching coal into the firebox. When the engineer passed through the town without responding to signals, the operator immediately notified the dispatcher at

Spokane that he thought a holdup had occurred.

While officials of the railroad at Spokane and Rathdrum were organizing posses, the mail car was being robbed where it had stopped between Trent and Yardley. Conductor Miley said today that the first intimation of a holdup was given when the electric lights on the train went out. An electrician repaired them, but they went out again.

"I knew it was a holdup," said Miley, "when I went forward and saw that the engine and mail car had been separated from the coaches. I dodged about in the darkness for a few minutes, and presently I saw one of the robbers shoot at the fireman, who told me afterward that he heard the bullet whizz by his head."

A young man who had been riding on the engine, and who was driven by the bandits, says the robbers emerged from the Palace Hotel at Sand Point, Idaho, and climbed to the top of the train, and remained until Rathdrum was reached. At that point they attempted to split the train but failed. They only succeeded after the cars came to a full stop.

## BATTLING NELSON TO MEET THOMPSON

Rochester, N. Y., April 30.—Batling Nelson will leave for his home in Hedgeswich Saturday, and Tuesday he will start for San Francisco to begin training for his fight with "Cyclone" Johnny Thompson, at Colma July 5.

That the champion was in earnest when he declared the McFarland match off was attested last night when he announced that he had made all arrangements to start for the coast.

"I don't like that forfeit talk," he said, "and the match won't come off as scheduled. They had better not talk of money matters until McFarland is man enough to pay his bills when someone guarantees his honesty. I introduced him once so that he could get credit with the Twentieth Century Clipping Bureau. He was sued for the money, and pleaded insanity. If he wants to fight me now he will have to bet \$5000 on his chances to win. My forfeit will be up in plenty of time for any match I enter. I have an awful beating in store for this packy."

Mercer, Pa., April 30.—The trial of James Boyle, accused of kidnaping Billie Whittle at Sharon, was today postponed until next Wednesday. The postponement was made because of the absence of Attorney Anderson, counsel for the defense.

According to the present plans, Mrs. Boyle, accused of complicity in the kidnaping will be tried first, her case being set for Tuesday.

Boyle was brought into court this morning, and all of the witnesses called in the case were present, when the postponement was announced.

## JACK LONDON'S ROT MADE HIM CRAZY

Oakland, Cal., April 30.—Charles Baker is held here awaiting his removal to the insane asylum. He is said to have lost his mind brooding over the socialistic writings of Jack London, and had become convinced that he was one of the under crust, hovering on the brink of the abyss.

A lecture by Austin Lewis, former Socialist candidate for governor of California, precipitated upon Baker an attack of melancholia that is thought to have resulted in a loss of his reason. He was committed to the state asylum by County Judge Wells.

## ANYWAY, HE SHOULD HAVE SQUARE DEAL

A. J. Smith, who is charged with holding up the clerk in Huges' jewelry store, seems to be getting considerably the worst of the deal. That he is the man who held up the clerk is practically certain, but he is at least entitled to some little charity. It does not seem possible that a man in his right mind would make the attempt, as he did, to hold up a store on the main street, and it is more than probable that his mind was temporarily unbalanced. The story that he had made elaborate preparations for hiding himself in a room over the store, and that the locks on the door had been changed, was absolutely without foundation, and, while The Journal published it, it later examined into the matter, and corrected its statement. Instead of there being an elaborately arranged plan for making a get-away, there seems to have been absolutely no arrangement made at all. The whole affair was as crude and visionary as that of some 10-year-old youngster going out to slay Indians. It is also asserted that Smith has been absent a number of years, and he does not account for where he was during the time. From this an inference is drawn that he might have been restrained of his liberty during a portion of that time. The Journal could find nothing to justify such a conclusion, and hence feels that Smith is getting a pretty bad deal. He will have to, and should answer for his acts here, but he is certainly entitled to a fair, square hearing, and should not be tried at the bar of public opinion, for some imaginary offense.

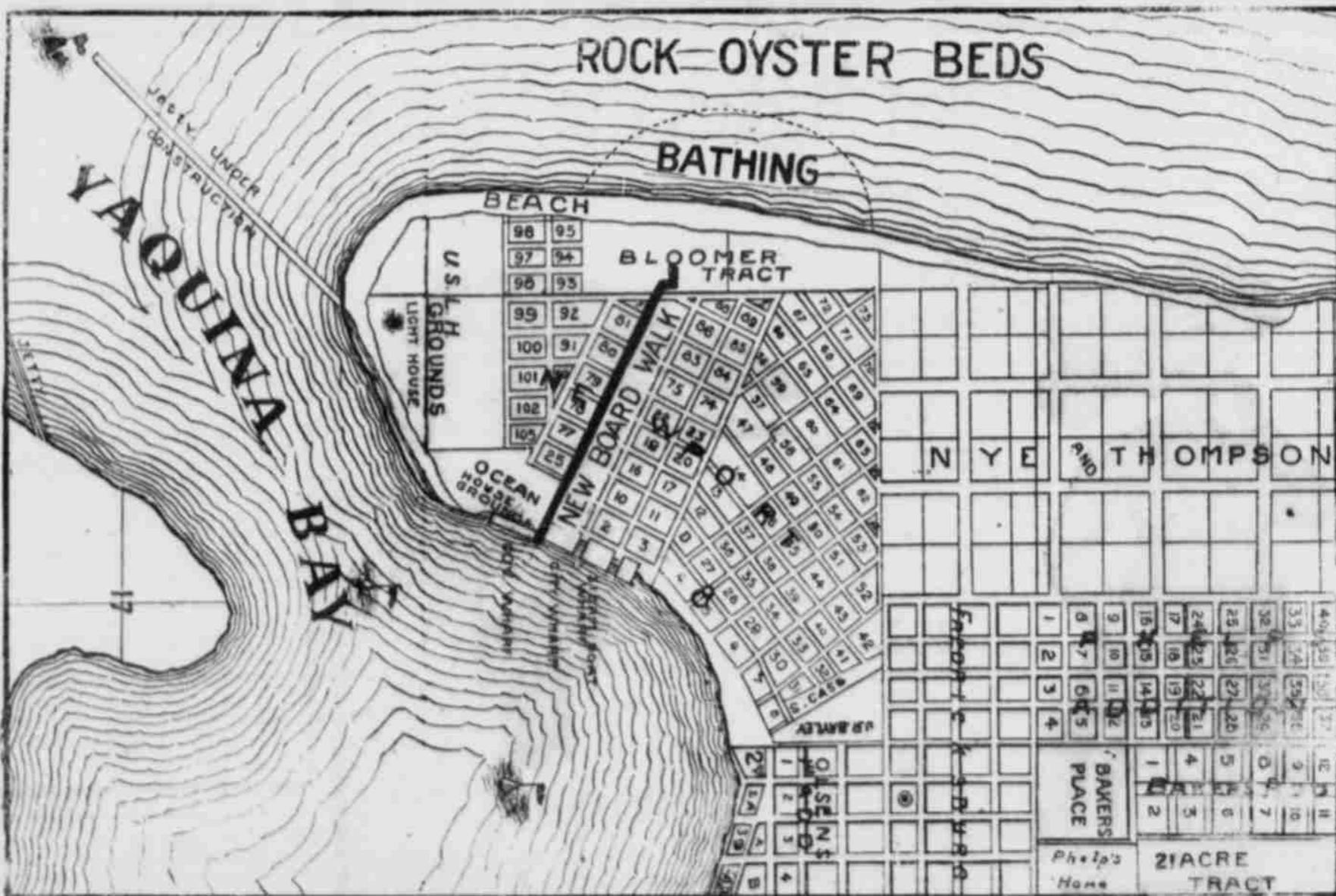
