GREAT RELAY RACE SALEM TO PORTLAND

At 9:02 this morning the relay race of 52 miles from Salem to Portland, between the Chemawa Indian Training School and the Y. M. C. A., of Portland, was set in motion by Governor Benson, who said the word "go" to Amos Smooker, running for Chemawa and D. Cooper, running for the Y. M. C. A., who will race the first five miles.

Smooker and Cooper left the west wing of the state capitol, with Smooker four feet in the lead. Both men ran with a long, easy stride, and the pace Smooker set from the start was swift. The pair were followed by autos, motor cycles and boys and men on wheels.

Amos Smooker is a clean built, powerful looking Indian, and is the relay racer who finished an easy winner in Portland last year. Governor Benson made a short talk to the runners, and gave them his heartiest wishes. He also handed each the following message to Mayor Lane of Portland, to be delivered on the arrival of the last two runners: "Honorable Harry Lane, Mayor, Portland, Oregon.

"Dear Sir: The State of Oregon sends greetings to Portland, the beautiful, the sure winner in the race of cities of the Northwest.

"Very truly yours,

"F. W. BENSON, Governor." Honeyman & DeHart, of Portland, have left with the governor a beautiful loving cup, which goes to the winner.

WAS ARRESTED FOR PASSING BAD CHECKS

His last offense was to pass a bogus draft of the Ladd & Tilton bank of Portland on the First National bank of Roseburg. It is probable Meyers will also be returned to this city to answer charges.

Detroit, Mich., May 1.—The barge George Nester foundered with eight men aboard during the storm on Lake Superior yesterday, according to advices received by the administrator of the Nester estate here today.

A message received from the Nester's agents at Baraga, Mich., states: "The Schoelcraft arrived today. She reports that the Nester parted her towing line off Huron Island yesterday noon, and was driven on the rocks. She is a total loss. All on board were drowned."

The Schoelcraft was a steam barge which was towing the Nester.
