A ball over the outfield fence, a three-base hit and several singles did business to the Salem Independents yesterday afternoon on the Asylum Avenue ball park by the J. G. Mack Company team of Portland. The husky visitors went after Jermain's curve balls yesterday one after the other and placed them at will until he was compelled to turn the job over to Johnson, who finished the game with some of the best pitching Salem fans have ever seen.

In the first inning, The Portland team put the ball in motion at bat. Joe Fay tapped a speedy grounder to Williams at short who threw him out at first. "Bobby" Burns, the heavyweight, went to bat and the same performance was gone through with with the same result with the exception of a wild throw by Williams to Carey at first, allowing Burns to set safe. Reed hit to Carey at first who tossed him out to Roberts, who backed the play, but Burns went third. Summerville, Portland's mighty slugger, then came to bat and connected with the ball full in the face and sent it sailing over the right field fence, clearing by 10 feet, bringing in Burns and himself.
