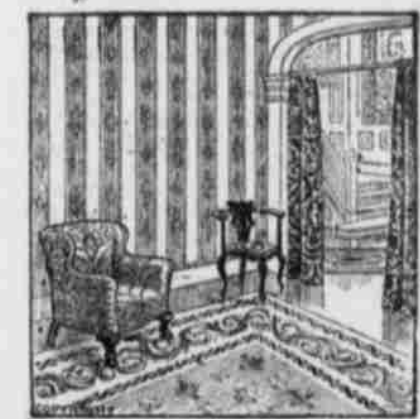

E. J. O'CONNELL TO MEET JOE LASALLE

What will probably be the best battle royal in wrestling matches so far pulled off in this city has been arranged under the management of the Auditorium Rink Company for next Friday evening, April 7, in the Grand opera house, between E. J. O'Connell, wrestling instructor at the Multnomah Amateur Athletic Club, and Joe LaSalle, the French-Canadian wrestler, who is now training at Eugene. The match will be two out of three falls; strangle holds barred; falls must be pin falls, meaning both shoulders shall be pinned to the ground.

E. J. O'Connell is a graduate of Yale college, of the class of 1907; is 24 years old and holds the welterweight and middleweight championships of the world—welterweight being 145 pounds and middleweight 158 pounds. He has beaten all the lightweights and recently he defeated Tremblay, the present lightweight champion, and a powerful little wrestler. The title did not pass, however, as neither contestant was within the lightweight limits. O'Connell only weighs about 142 pounds and has therefore been compelled to go out of his class to win the welterweight and middleweight championships. He is a very popular wrestler wherever he goes, and in the estimation of many, the peer of any wrestler in the world today at 160 pounds.

Joe LaSalle, who has recently come here from the Middle West, has an enviable record. The two greatest were the defeat of Peterson, the terrible Swede, in Chicago about eight months ago, and Busch, the celebrated German wrestler, who came to this country touted as a world-beater, and

an all round bad man to mix with. LaSalle is training in Eugene at present, and is about 29 years of age and weighs 181 pounds. O'Connell will have to give him 40 pounds.

O'Connell and LaSalle recently wrestled at Eugene, and went two hours and thirty-five minutes without a throw, and the match was called at midnight. It has been distinctly understood between the two wrestlers and all concerned that the match next Friday night is to be to the finish, the winner to take all.

O'Connell, although realizing he is getting far out of his class, says he is anxious to meet LaSalle and intends to give him a hard tussle.

This is the second of the many matches to come to Salem, and fans are looking forward to the O'Connell LaSalle bout with much interest, owing to the fact that these two men have made themselves prominent with the world in general by their fine work on the mat.

The managers of the match are figuring on getting Frank Gotch to give an exhibition match here, but it is not known as yet whether he will come.

BUT THE PRINCE CANNOT PAY FOR HIS CHILDREN

Paris, May 5.—Princess Robert Debroglie, formerly Estelle Dolores Alexander, of San Francisco, Cal., was granted a divorce today on the grounds of desertion and non-support. She was given the custody of their only child, but must pay the prince \$60 monthly.

Members of the family of the prince are highly pleased, as they consider the marriage undesirable. It is understood that the prince's father will now reclaim his son, whom he disowned at the time of his marriage.

The princess was the divorced wife of Sidney Velt, a rich importer of New York. Before her marriage to Velt she was a chorus girl.

A sensation was created some time ago among the nobility when the prince announced that he would accompany his wife while she sang in music halls. Powerful influence was brought to bear upon the couple, and their plans were frustrated. Afterward the princess supported her husband by singing in the cabarets.
