COLLEGE GIRL WAS VICTIM

College Park, Cal., May 7.—Wearied by their all-night hunt for the fiend who brutally attacked Miss Minnie Withrow, the attractive 29-year-old daughter of one of the most prominent families in the community, the band of deputies from the county sheriff's office and young men of this place today gave over the search to fresh posses, who are scouring every foot of country for miles around. The father and brothers of the young woman refused to give up the hunt, and are determined upon capturing the man who made the vicious assault.

Miss Withrow, who is a former student of the University of the Pacific, was walking from her home to Santa Clara late yesterday. While passing a grain field, she was attacked and gagged with a handkerchief. She was dragged into the field after a desperate struggle with her assailant. An hour later she stumbled into her home, her clothing torn to tatters and her face and arms pitifully bruised.

The sheriff's office in San Jose was notified, and a posse organized here to take up the hunt. Every able-bodied man in this village has joined the hunters, who declare they will wreak summary vengeance if the brute is run to earth.

FRENCH GOVERNMENT UP AGAINST BIG TRADES ORGANIZATION

Paris, May 7.—The French government today accepted the gauge of battle thrown down by its employees, who have organized a trade union, in defiance of the law. Proceedings to dissolve the union were commenced, and the announcement made that all of the leaders of the movement would be criminally prosecuted. This prompt action on the part of the government may prevent a revolution, or it may precipitate one. The organization of the union which gives the postal, telegraph and telephone employees the right to strike, followed an attempt on the part of an employees' committee to see Premier Clemenceau. The premier pleaded illness, and refused to see the delegation, which wanted to present him a complaint that the government was not living up to its agreement, made when the recent strike was declared off.

PROSPECTS GOOD FOR REUNION OF THE SHAW FAMILY

Santa Barbara, Cal., May 7.—Although Mrs. Nettie F. Shaw, wife of James F. Shaw, the Boston traction magnate and state senator, lost her petition for a writ of habeas corpus to secure the release of her son, 11 years old, Eldridge Shaw, from the custody of the local chief of police, yet the lad and his mother will journey eastward together probably today. Accompanying them will be H. F. Eldridge, father of Mrs. Shaw and grandfather of the boy, who is in a way a temporary trustee of the court to see that the little fellow is delivered to his father in Boston.

Louis Fields, the family butler, who assisted the local detectives and shaw's private agents to identify Mrs. Shaw here when they were traced to Santa Barbara, returned to Boston yesterday. Keno Marble, formerly Shaw's chauffeur, with whom Mrs. Shaw is alleged to have eloped and with whom she lived here for a year under the name of Mrs. Marble, has disappeared. It is intimated that the Shaws and H. F. Eldridge, who is a millionaire brewer of Portsmouth, N. H., will confer upon plans for a quiet separation without further publicity and will come to a compromise concerning the disposition of the boy. This conference probably will be held at Boston as soon as the Shaws and Eldridge arrive.
