--BUT NO ODDS**

According to reports coming from Eugene, that city is with La Salle to the finish, as they think he will win the contest without a doubt. Portland fans are taking the opposite view of the matter, and are boosting O'Connell at every point of the match. Good crowds are expected from both Eugene and Portland, and there will probably be hundreds of interested fans witness the contest, coming from nearby towns here.

Dan Sullivan, who is claimant of more or less notoriety as a professional wrestler, has failed to meet any agreement offered by Eddie O'Connell, and it is evident from his speech in this city regarding his unsuccessful efforts to arrange a match with O'Connell, that he is somewhat inclined to shy at the little man, as it has been frequently reported lately that O'Connell has offered Sullivan all kinds of good inducements to meet him, but he refused or cogitated some way of eluding further arrangements for a bout.

In spite of the fact that Joe La Salle, the wrestler from Eugene, outweighs Eddie O'Connell, the gritty little lightweight champion, Salem fans are right on the bet that the man from the Multnomah Athletic Club will pin the big 118-pounder to the stage in a fair and square wrestle tonight. Wrestler O'Connell has sur-

ly won the admiration of the Salem enthusiasts, notwithstanding they have never had the opportunity of seeing him act on the mat, and they have good faith in his ability. O'Connell fully realizes that he must give La Salle 40 pounds the best of the match, but he is confident that he can throw the French-Canadian. La Salle, however, is just as sure of winning the bout, although he does not expect to put his opponent down with out a fierce struggle. The bout La Salle had with Eddie O'Connell in Eugene recently, when they strained for 2 hours and 45 minutes without



either being pinned was a good demonstration of the two contestants' strength and endurance. This bout was called off at 12 o'clock, and tonight there must be a fall, and the wrestlers have decided to put no time limit on the bout.

It is almost an established fact now that the sport of wrestling has come to Salem to stay, as bouts are being arranged for dates in this city between wrestlers all over the state. The managers and promoters of the sport are making efforts to induce Frank Gotch to give an exhibition bout here in the near future, and it is possible Salem fans will be accommodated by the big wrestler.
