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## W. B. HAYWOOD SPEAKS TO LARGE AUDIENCE

W. B. Haywood, the man who was kidnapped by a conspiracy between the fool governor of Idaho and the bigger fool governor of Colorado, who thus armed him with a regular Gatling gun to attack them with, spoke at Commercial Hall last night the capacity of the hall.

He was introduced by R. D. Minton in a few well chosen words, and, without any preliminary, began to talk business from the start.

Haywood at once strikes you as a man of much force. He is of rather heavy build, extremely broad shoulders, a generous waistband, and though having, like "Pitchfork" Tillman, but one eye, he makes that very expressive. His voice is full, and carries well, his stage presence easy, his gesticulation at once graceful and suggestive, and his command of English, as well as sarcasm, something to be wondered at.

He gave considerable time to union labor, and went into detail as to the objects and aims of the Western Federation of Miners, urging all laboring men to unite and stand together for a fair proportion of what they created. At the same time he drew a picture of capital, and became somewhat bitter in showing the relation between it and labor.

He said: "The gold miner is in a peculiar condition with regard to his employer, for the reason that the employer cannot raise the price of his product, to meet increased cost of production, and from this fact came the bitter war between the federation and mine owners. The shorter hours and increased pay meant, perhaps, a small reduction in dividends, and, as capital has no soul, but its gold, it was so hurt it had to stand the loss instead of passing it on to the consumer. He added no man should eat his bread in the sweat of another man's face. Here are a few of his statements:

"Taft was asked what would a mass of hungry men out of work and out of money do?" and Taft frankly replied, "I don't know."

Bryan asked the same question talked for half an hour, but, like a Mother Hubbard dress, he surrounded everything and touched nothing.

The prohibitionists tackled the subject, and wisely suggested that they should stop drinking.

"As though," he remarked, "because a man had quit eating, to also quit drinking would appease his hunger."

The Socialist demanded that the government, state, etc., should in such conditions take care of the individual, and should in fact prevent such conditions arising.

Labor of muscle or brain created everything. Capital—nothing. Its symbol was the skull and crossbones. It had neither patriotism, country or humanity.

When a man is starving he has a right to take enough to save his life.

It is a crime to commit suicide by starvation or commit murder by starving your wife and child to death. Is it any more crime to steal than to murder. I do not believe either in stealing or murder, hence I advocate the things that lead to neither.

He gave a graphic description of the bull pen in the Cour d'Alencas, of the strike and conflict in Colorado, and of the arrest of himself, Moyer and Pettibone, without a warrant or a charge being made against them, and of their being rushed out of the state on a special train that had the right of way, and that was "furnished free by the railroads," of his beating the regular mail time 12 hours; of being met at the depot with "black maras," and hurried to the Idaho penitentiary.

His descriptions were powerfully made, and were affecting. The story

## TURKEY ALREADY WANTS TO DEPOSE NEW SULTAN

Constantinople, May 11.—Correspondence between Abdul Hamid and one of the European monarchs will be made public shortly and Young Turks declare today will cause an international scandal. By a process of elimination certain Young Turks have decided that the monarch in question is Emperor William of Germany and have openly asserted their belief.

Little can be learned of the nature of the correspondence, which was found in Yildiz Kiosh after the deposition of Abdul. Many rumors are afloat regarding its nature and in some quarters it is said the writer encouraged Abdul to rearrange the plot for the uprising of the reactionaries.

During the usual ceremony of coronation yesterday there were many evidences that the Young Turks will not be satisfied with the administration of the new ruler and political excitement has far from subsided here.

Although Mehmed V has not yet given cause for such assertions the discontented ones declare that he is weak minded and has decided despot tendencies. Some of the more rabid agitators are already advocating dethroning the new sultan.

## SONS OF HERMANN MUST BE AMERICANS

Seattle, May 11.—The congregation of the First Presbyterian church of this city is considerably excited by the pulpit declaration of its pastor, the Rev. A. A. Matthews, that the practice of soliciting advertisements for church fairs and bazaar is an ecclesiastical form of graft.

"No merchant ever sold a pair of shoes by advertising them in a church bazaar," said the minister, "and therefore when the church charged for that advertisement it was unable to give value received. The merchant advertised because he was asked to do so by the church. The advertisement was useless to him, and such efforts are nothing short of ecclesiastical form of graft."

## FUNERAL OF L. B. GEER NEAR SILVERTON SUNDAY

The funeral of the late L. B. Geer, state land agent under Governor T. T. Geer, was held from his home on the old R. C. Geer place south of Silverton in the Waldo hills, Sunday at 11 o'clock, conducted by the Odd Fellows, an organization of which Mr. Geer had been a devoted member. He was a member of Chemeketa lodge No. 1, from which he withdrew and became one of the organizers of Silver lodge, Silverton. A large delegation of Salem three-linkers left this city at 8 o'clock Sunday morning and took a prominent part in the funeral service.

It was appropriate that this Oregon pioneer was buried to the accompaniment of May showers, the first to bless the valley in six weeks, and that will soon make green the mound under which he sleeps.

Rev. P. S. Knight conducted the services at the home and then the Odd Fellows took charge and another service was conducted by them at the grave. The beautiful hard oak casket was covered with hundreds of choice flowers and the grave was a mass of bloom and verdure.

The pall bearers were A. G. Steelhammer, J. A. Riches, John Porter, Edward C. Small, R. L. Bowers, all from Silverton Silver lodge No. 21, and L. F. Aldrich of this city. Fifty carriages were in the procession to the grave.

Silver lodge, of which the deceased was a charter member, was instituted in 1868.
