## MEMORIAL DAY FINE PROGRAM

The joint committee on Memorial Day exercises, appointed by Sedgwick Post and Sedgwick W. R. C., would hereby cordially invite Company M. O. N. G., the Spanish War Veterans, the Sons of Veterans, the Ladies of the G. A. R. and any and all other patriotic and civic organizations to join them in a proper observance of the day. The program is not completed as to details, but will be in a few days, when it will be announced. The exercises of the day will begin, at what hour in the morning will be announced later, by the W. R. C., performing their beautiful ritualistic service in memory of those who died while serving in the U. S. navy. This service will be held on the South Commercial street bridge. It is also more than probable that the W. R. C. will serve a "basket dinner" in Marion Park at noon, where the old soldiers and their families may meet and eat their noon-day lunch, and that the ladies of the G. A. R. will, after their usual custom of decorating the graves of the soldier dead in Lee Mission cemetery, serve a free dinner to the old soldiers and their families in their hall, corner of Commercial and Center streets, at the noon hour. At or near 2 p. m., the G. A. R. parade will form at the corner of State and Liberty streets, and march east to Church, thence north to Court, thence West to Commercial, thence north to Chemeketa and counter-march on Commercial south to State, where they will take the cars for the cemetery, where the usual ritualistic ceremonies will be observed, after which the Hon. P. H. D'Arcy will deliver an address appropriate to the occasion. This being a general outline of the program of the day, is subject to change in some of the minor details, of which due notice will be given.

### COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS WEDNESDAY EVENING

Alderman Stolz was in the chair, in the absence of Mayor Rodgers. Eight blocks of paving were put through to assessment and contract will be let Monday night. The park board was ordered to appear before the city council Monday night and show cause why certain ordinances were not enforced. The matter of a contract with Minto Bros. for gravel from the island was referred to City Attorney Keys. Special committee authorized to ask bids from contractors for erecting a gravel screen and minimum price on gravel. Alderman Stockton reported that Warren Brothers had prepared specifications for cheaper hard surface pavement for residence streets to cost but \$3 per running foot for a 27-foot street. The committee on parks reported that they had secured an option on the Fairmount hill property from Rev. Elworthy for \$10,000 for what would make about a 25-acre park. The report was unanimously adopted. The aldermen present were Eldridge, Elliott, Greenbaum, Hofer, Millard, Moffett, Stolz, Stockton, Waters.

### FIREBUGS AT WORK IN LEWISTON, IDAHO

(United Press Leased Wire.) Lewiston, Idaho, May 13.—Circumstances indicating that firebugs started the fire in which George Brammer and his son, wealthy farmers in this section of Idaho, lost their lives early yesterday, are being investigated today. The Brammers were sleeping in their home near Gifford, 30 miles east of Lewiston, when the flames attacked the building. It is apparent from the position of the charred remains that father and son were first overcome by the smoke and then burned to death in their beds.

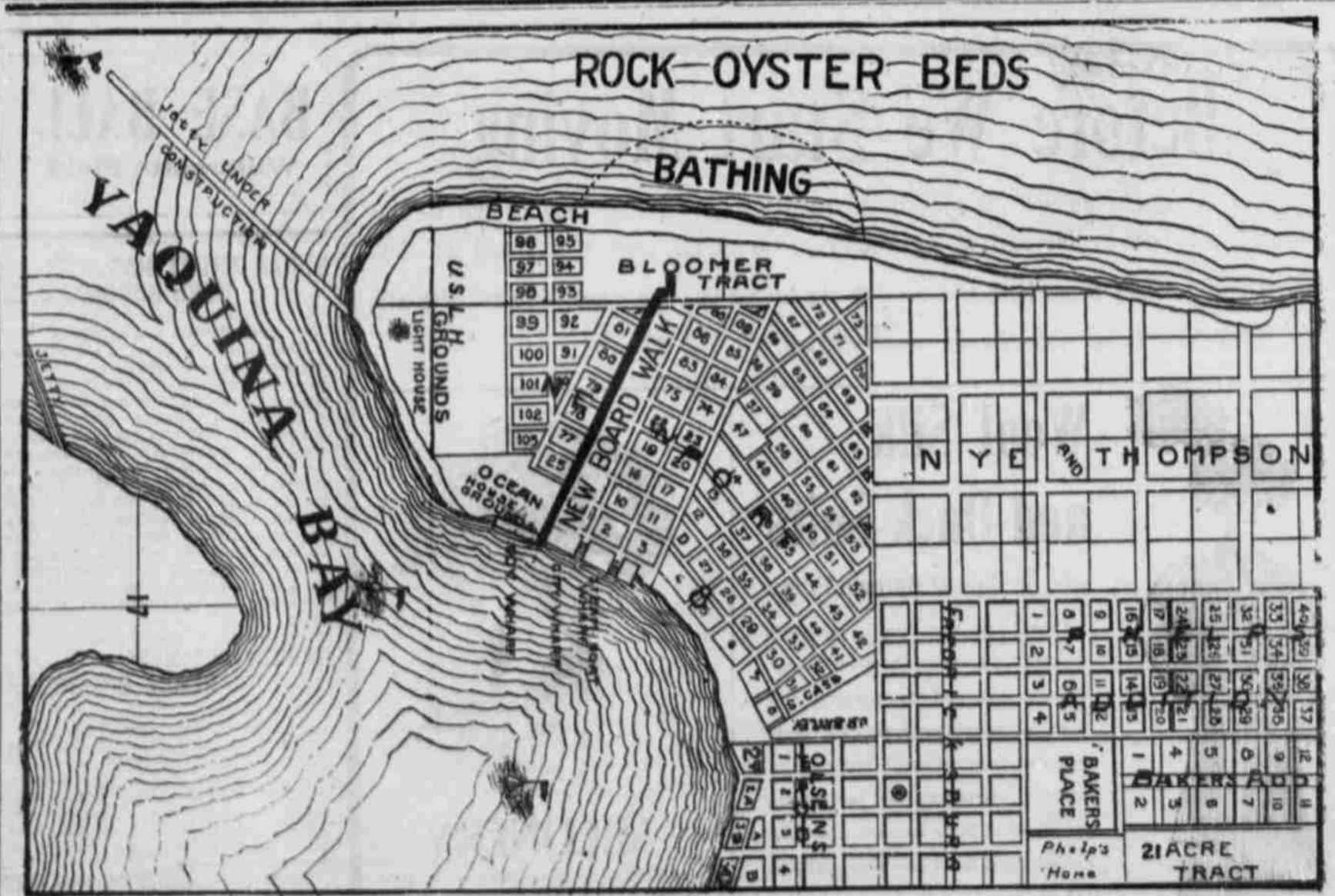
