

FAIRMOUNTS DEFEATED THE SALEM INDEPENDENTS

In a game which belonged to no one up to the ninth inning, yesterday on the Asylum avenue ball grounds, the Fairmount club, of South Salem, defeated the Salem Independent ball aggregation by a score of 7 to 5 in eleven innings.

Elmer Daue, Fairmount's speedy twirler, pitched the game of his life yesterday, striking out seven men and holding the Salem swatters down to only eight hits during the eleven innings. Daue had all kinds of fire from the first inning to the last, and not once did he allow the opponents to get him up in the air, notwithstanding that he was in a bad hole

at one time, with three men on bases and one man down.

Bert Johnson, the Salem Independent twirler, was evidently off his feed yesterday, as the Fairmount lads chased his twisters all over the green, getting 12 hits off him. Johnson's inability to get the South Salem boys off their feet, and Fairmount's Al batting eye, was the principle cause for the Independents losing the contest. Johnson is not totally to blame, however, as the men behind him played some very weak ball, including several plays which were nothing but exhibitions. Late yesterday Hintz entered a huge boiler in the rear of his house to paint the interior walls. He was nearly overcome by the fumes of the paint, but was able to call to his wife for aid.

Unable to extricate her husband from his position, and frightened almost into hysterics, Mrs. Hintz hurried around the high spite fence, and begged Herbert to come to the rescue.

Herbert, after three minutes' heroic work, pulled Hintz from the death-trap, and assisted in his resuscitation.

As soon as he was able to walk, Hintz went to the home of a carpenter and gave orders for the immediate destruction of the fence.
