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DRASTIC DRUGSTORE ORDINANCE DEFEATED IN CITY COUNCIL

The Prenal ordinance to apply the provisions of the state local option law to the drug stores was defeated on third reading last night. Hill, Moffitt, Moore, Prenal voting for it, and Greenbaum, Hofer, Low, Stolz, Waters voting against it. Mr. Prenal fought to have it go over, but the council was against the measure. It sought to repeal the license ordinance under which drug stores must pay \$200 per year, if they sell liquors at retail. The drug store operators selling any liquors by the drink or bottle, or otherwise than on prescription of physicians, and so long as they comply with that law, they are not required to take out a license. At present there is very little complaint of liquors sold in the drug stores. The Prenal ordinance legalized alcoholic liquors for medicinal purposes, which some of the aldermen did not wish to consent to.

MANY MORE BLOCKS ARE ORDERED PAVED WITH BITULITHIC

With Alderman Stolz in the chair the city council advanced several paving ordinances. Bitulithic paving was ordered down in accordance with petitions on Ferry street from Front to Liberty, and on Court street from Church to Twelfth and on State from Twelfth to Mill creek. From Mill creek on to the city limits that street is to be widened and macadamized.

OYSTER TRUST MAN HAS THREE AFFINITIES

Oakland, Cal., May 18.—Charges that Louis H. Margutti, secretary of the Pacific Coast Oyster Association, attempted to kill his 3-year-old child, are made by his wife, in an answer to a suit for divorce on file in the local courts today.

In her answer Mrs. Margutti alleged that her husband once tried to smother the babe, and another time left a revolver near the infant in the hope that it would shoot itself. She also alleges that he once expressed the desire to throw the child into the bay.

Mrs. Margutti declares that her husband has three "affinities," and that he told one of them that he had made a great mistake in marrying, and that he intended to get a divorce while he was young.

Chicago, May 17.—According to a report made public by the Pennsylvania lines which is in circulation today, the system carried 141,659,543 passengers over 23,000 miles of rails without the loss of life to a single passenger from train accident during 1908. The number of passengers injured throughout the year was 102, a decrease of 81.6 per cent from the casualty list of 1907.

Notice is hereby given that the common council of the city of Salem, Oregon, deems it expedient to improve and propose to improve at the expense of abutting and adjacent property Winter street in the city of Salem, Oregon, from the north curb line of Mill street to the north line of Oak street, the roadway of said portion of said street shall be improved full width from curb to curb by grading the same and placing thereon a crushed rock improvement, provided intersections shall be improved for a width of 29 1/2 feet on both sides of the center line of said Winter street, excepting herefrom, however, a strip 7 feet in width extending full length of the proposed improvement to be occupied by the street railway track of the Portland Railway Light & Power Co., and improved by said company. Curb lines shall be established and said street shall be improved in every respect in accordance with the plans and specifications adopted therefor by the common council on file in the office of the city recorder, and which also show an estimate of the cost.

Notice of Intention to Improve a Portion of Winter Street.

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Salem, Oregon, deems it expedient to improve and propose to improve, at the expense of abutting and adjacent property, Winter street, in the City of Salem, Oregon, from a point 1 1/2 feet south of the south rail of the railroad track of the Southern Pacific Co., where it crosses said Winter street at the intersection of Winter and Trade streets to the north curb line of Mill street. Said improvements shall be made with crushed rock for a width of 32 feet on both sides of the center line of said street, excepting therefrom a space 7 feet in width extending along the center of said Winter street, which is to receive the street railway track of the Portland Railway, Light & Power Co., and to be improved by said company, and excepting that portion of said Winter street which is intersected by the tributary of South Mill Creek.
