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TO ENJOIN PAYMENT FOR CRATER LAKE ROAD

Attorney L. H. McMahan, who some time ago expressed his determination to bring an action to prevent the payment by the state treasurer of any state money towards the construction of the Crater Lake road, has kept his word, filing a complaint yesterday afternoon. The complaint is brought in the name of J. K. Sears against State Treasurer Geo. A. Steel, and is as follows:

Plaintiff alleges: That plaintiff long has been and is now a resident, citizen and taxpayer of and within Oregon, and long has and does now own valuable real and personal property in said state taxed and subject to taxation therein.

That he brings this suit for himself and on behalf of all other taxpayers of Oregon.

That defendant is the elected, duly qualified and acting treasurer of Oregon, and as such treasurer threatens to and will, unless restrained by this court, pay out of the general funds of the state one hundred thousands (\$100,000) dollars to aid in the construction of a road from Medford, Oregon, to Crater Lake and from Klamath Falls, Oregon, to Crater Lake, in accordance with the provisions of an act of the legislature of 1909, filed in the office of the secretary of state Feb. 23, 1909, entitled "An Act appropriating \$100,000 to aid in the construction of a state road from the Pacific ocean via Crater Lake to the Idaho

boundary, and to provide for the appointment of a commission to supervise the expenditure of such money and to superintend the construction of such road."

That the sole purpose of said act is to assist the counties of Jackson and Klamath in constructing an automobile and carriage road from Medford to Crater Lake and from Klamath Falls to Crater Lake for the use of tourists and other pleasure seekers and not for the purpose of constructing a state road from the Pacific ocean to the Idaho boundary.

That there is a wagon road from Medford to Crater Lake and that Medford and Klamath Falls are connected both by wagon road and railroad.

Wherefore, plaintiff asks that injunction issue restraining defendant from paying either the whole or any portion of the money appropriated by said act for the purposes therein named.

That plaintiff have judgment against defendant for plaintiff's costs and disbursements herein.

EUGENE HAS BIG BLAZE

ONLY HEROIC WORK SAVED CITY FROM DESTRUCTION

Eugene, Or., May 26.—A big black hole in the business section of this city today represents the spot where \$50,000 worth of property stood before the fire late yesterday afternoon destroyed it.

That this remainder of the section is intact is attributed to the fact that the blaze originated in the day time, and that the wind suddenly shifted, when it seemed that no part of the district could be saved. The fire, which started in a livery stable, had eaten its way to a row of adjoining buildings and leaping higher every minute before the fire department and volunteer bucket brigades got into action.

Students of the University of Oregon pitched in and worked like Trojans, helped to save several stores from catching fire. While all merchants along the main street were preparing to carry their stocks to places of safety, the wind suddenly shifted, and danger of further property loss ended.

YOUNG STUDENT KILLED
