SENT TO THE PEN FOR NINETY-SEVEN YEARS

San Francisco, May 28.—S. H. Fisher, found guilty of robbing United States mail boxes in this city and in Alameda, is in the city prison, awaiting removal to San Quentin, to begin the serving of four sentences, aggregating 97 years. As these sentences run conditionally, Fisher probably will have to spend but 13 years in the state prison.

Fisher pleaded guilty to two indictments. In one indictment there was four counts, each for forging, counterfeiting and having in his possession keys made to fit United States letter boxes. He was sentenced to eight years imprisonment on each count.

The second indictment contained 13 counts, and he was sentenced to 13 concurrent 5-year terms.

An investigation of Fisher's past record revealed that he served penal terms in Texas and Australia. He is also said to have stolen more than 2500 letters from mail boxes in Los Angeles. At the time of his capture, March 13, he was trying to cash a check for \$500, stolen from the mails.

A THOUSAND MILLMEN GO OUT ON STRIKE

Yreka, Cal., May 28.—The box factory, sawmills and sash and door plant of the McCloud River Lumber Company are tied up today as the result of a strike declared by 1000 employees of the company. The men left their work late yesterday, and today delegations are on the way to the logging camps in mountains to induce other employees of the camp to join the ranks of the disgruntled laborers.

The strikers, it is thought, will ask for a raise of 25 cents a day for common labor. The present schedule for a day of ten hours is \$1.75. The Italian employees of the mills, numbering about 600, are thought to be the prime movers in the walkout.

President Queale, of the company, is in San Francisco. Until his return it is impossible to announce the action the company will take.

PLEADS GUILTY TO COUNTERFEITING

Chicago, May 27.—Pleading guilty to complicity in a plot involving the passing of spurious coin of Argentine Republic, Robert Scott, of Alameda, Cal., today declared that Juan Santos, an official of the Argentine land office, originated the scheme. Scott was sentenced to three years' imprisonment.

Scott told the court that he was sent to Argentine Republic by J. D. Fletcher, a California mining man, to purchase mineral land. He declared that Santos offered to give him the land for nothing if he would furnish counterfeit plates for five and ten-pesos pieces. He came to the United States, and had the plates etched, but was arrested several weeks ago in Kokomo, Ind.

COLLAR DROPPED OFF FIRE ENGINE HORSE

A fire alarm was turned in at the station yesterday evening, coming from residents at the corner of Oak and Twelfth streets, who were in fear that a large pile of old telegraph poles which had caught fire would spread to the adjacent dwellings. An unforced accident occurred when the chemical engine left the station. Driver Townsend had brought the three big horses out onto Chemeketa street and was putting them through at a fair speed, when the collar of one of the horses came unfastened, and that animal dropped out of the run altogether for the time being. The other two remaining animals, however, persisted in running, and Driver Townsend was compelled to guide them onto the front yard of a dwelling at the corner of Chemeketa and High streets, in order to stop them, one line having been put entirely out of commission. The unharnessed horse was caught soon and placed back in his position, and the chemical engine proceeded to the configuration, where it put every thing out of danger. Driver Townsend did good work in stopping the two horses as soon as he did, and no damage was done to the engine.

CUSTOM INSPECTORS

SWAMPED AT SEATTLE

Seattle, Wash., May 28.—Ross E. Chestnut, deputy collector in charge of United States customs, today ordered an increase in the force of inspectors necessary to inventory quickly the Japanese exhibit for the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition. Recent large shipments have given the inspectors on the grounds more work than they could do, and there has been a delay in getting the exhibits in place.

According to the rules of the customs service, each article must be listed and tagged. With the floor at the Japanese building covered with packing cases, the work was slow and tedious. If necessary, an effort will be made to expedite matters by making an inventory of the exhibit after it has been put in place.

Steamer Not Damaged.

Quarantine, Staten Island, N. Y., May 28.—The liner Princess Alice, which went aground just outside the narrows yesterday in a fog, was floated today, and will proceed on her voyage to Cherbourg as soon as her cargo is replaced. The vessel was found to be undamaged.
