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POLICE CAPTURE BAD MAN

COMMITTED THREE MURDERS-CHARGED WITH FOURTH

Victoria, B. C., May 28.—After a chase through Northern British Columbia, Charles Phillips, alias Charles Benton, a half-breed Indian, has been arrested by the provincial police and is being held at Quesnel, B. C., pending instructions. Phillips is suspected of being one of the three hold-up men who entered a saloon at Midway, B. C., and, after killing the proprietor, robbed the cash till.

Phillips served a term in the New Westminster penitentiary for killing a constable who tried to arrest him for horse stealing. Later he came to Seattle and murdered Detective Jas. Wells, who was taking him to the police station in the patrol wagon. For this crime Phillips served 12 years in the state penitentiary. On July 4, last, following his release, he went to Republic, Wash., where he shot and killed Royal Siebert, a deputy sheriff.

Phillips will be brought to Victoria.

HENRY HAAS STILL CONFINED TO HIS BED

Henry Haas, one of the first business men to come to Salem, is confined to his bed at his home on North Front street suffering from an operation performed several days ago, and although he is holding his own fairly well, he is in a very weak condition at present.

The old-timers will remember that Henry Haas, he being about the first jeweler in the town, set the town clock in the court house in position and has kept the big timepiece in running order ever since. Mr. Haas was at one time leader in Salem's first band and orchestra, and also a member of the Salem fire department years ago. Salem owes considerable to Henry Haas for its present growth, as he has always been an active worker for any affair which would be beneficial to the city.

WANTS INFORMATION ABOUT STORED BOOKS

A letter was received by Chief of Police Gibson this morning from Chief of Police Wilson of San Diego, Cal., in which he states that an Oregon author, J. P. Anderson of Toledo, who wrote a book entitled "Opening of the First of the Seven Seals," had died in San Diego recently. The California officer is desirous of learning the whereabouts of a certain collection of books on which he holds a bill of sale, and inquires in his letter if there had been a barn burned up in this city during the past three years. If these books can be recovered by Chief Wilson he wishes to sell them and use the money in burying the author, who, according to the communication, was in poor financial circumstances. Before the author passed away, Chief Wilson states, he told him that he (Wilson) would find the books at a store, and storage paid on them, but so far no trace of them can be found and Chief Gibson is called upon to assist in the search.

There has been several stables burned here during the past three years but the chief here does not remember of anything like the books described being destroyed. However, he will make an effort to locate them.

SUE TO RECOVER ON INSURANCE POLICY

A complaint against the Horticultural Fire Relief of Oregon was filed this morning by the Blumauer-Frank Drug Company of Portland to recover \$1000 insurance on the destroyed property of the Arleta Pharmacy Company.

In the complaint it is alleged by the plaintiffs that the Arleta Pharmacy Company, a corporation, at one time held a policy in the Horticultural Fire Relief firm for \$1000 as a protection against fire. The Pharmacy company's establishment was destroyed by fire recently and the proprietors made over to the Blumauer-Frank Company a promissory note in the sum of \$1500, and after the fire they then turned a \$41 premium over to the plaintiffs, together with the \$1000 insurance policy. The complaint alleges none of the \$1000 policy has been paid by the insurance company and asks the court to decree them the amount. Attorneys Joseph & Hancy appear for the plaintiffs.
