SEVEN CLIPPER SHIPS

PUT ON RUN FROM SAN FRANCISCO TO NEW YORK

(United Press. Leased Wire.) San Francisco, May 28.—The announcement of Bates and Chesebrough of this city, that they have closed a deal with the Standard Oil Company, whereby seven of that company's vessels will be operated between this port and New York, is believed by shippers today to be a move for relief from the combination now existing.

Two months ago the Bates and Chesebrough interests contracted with Arthur Sewall & Company, of Bath, Maine, for the use of four steel clippers between San Francisco and New York. These vessels, with the addition of the Standard carriers, insure to coast shippers facilities for the transportation of an aggregate per annum cargo of 115,500 tons.

The rates that will become effective when the new vessels go on probably will be 30, 32 1/2 and 35 cents, an average of 7 1/2 cents less than the Pacific Mail rate. It is estimated the saving will amount to \$1,000,000 a year.

Cargo's are already being signed, and the first trips of the new carriers probably will be made in the near future.

Among the vessels of the fleet are the *Acme*, *Astral* and *Atlas*. The *Astral* is now in Oriental waters, and will clear for this port within the week.

In view of the reduction of the New York rates, it was announced that 1200 tons of Los Angeles freight, consigned to New York, is already on the way to San Pedro.

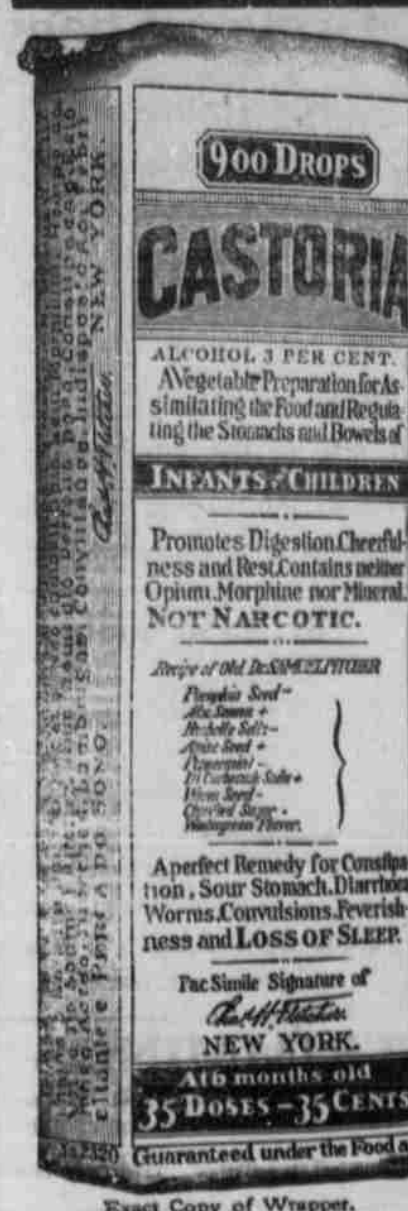
Two columns of infantry are pursuing the Moros. The troops were defending friendly natives when the attack was made on May 22.
