BRAVE FILIPINO SAVED MANY LIVES

[United Press Leased Wire.]

Hong Kong, May 31.—Officers Larkin and Rapp and three members of the American collier Nanshan, which has just reached this port, were killed in a typhoon which struck the vessel during her trip between Manila and Hong Kong. The water shipped during the storm generated poisonous gases below decks, and the men were suffocated before they could be rescued by other members of the crew.

To the bravery of a Filipino named Cruz, Captain Carter, of the Nanshan owes his life. Cruz entered the officer's cabin at the risk of his own life, and carried his captain to the pure air on deck. He made seven trips, arousing all the officers except Rapp and Larkin.

The Nanshan is attached to the Pacific fleet. She is manned by civilian officers and crew.

KETCHEL AND PAPKE TO MEET JULY 5

San Francisco, May 31.—Stanley Ketchel and Billy Papke will settle their long-standing dispute over the world in a 20-round fight at Cofroth's Mission arena here July 5, according to an announcement made today by the promoter.

The articles were signed last night by Willis Britt and Ed. Papke, managers for the fighters.

Each man is to weigh in at 155 pounds four hours before the fight, and forfeit money of \$5000 a side to stand as a bet, and go to the winner.

The purse is to be 60 per cent of the gross receipts, 25 per cent to the winner and 25 per cent to the loser.

Both contestants are to be in San Francisco by June 18, and neither of them is to engage in a decisive bout after June 10.

The referee is to be chosen by June 18, and will be either Billy Roche, Eddie Smith, Eddie Graney or Chas. T. Kreling.

NELSON WOULD FOLLOW JEFFRIES' FOOTSTEPS

San Francisco, May 31.—Battling Nelson announced today that his manager, Willis Britt, had signed him to fight Ad. Wolgast before Tom McCaroy's club at Los Angeles during Elks' week, July 12 to 19. It is understood that the Los Angeles fight will be worth more financially to the Battler than his 23-round go with Dick Hyland here Saturday.

The Battler has not made any definite plans for the future, but it is hinted broadly that he would like to follow the footsteps of Jeffries, by cleaning up everything in sight, and retiring with unquestioned laurels.

It is probable that after meeting Wolgast Nelson will go to Oklahoma, where he has a \$5000 pickup awaiting him.

Following his fight with Thompson here September 9, Nelson may go to Australia. He has heard that the promoters are awaiting over there with hands full of money, and feels that it would be an injustice not to relieve them of their burden. It is at the end of this prospective trip that the little Dane expects to tie himself to be uncut.

NEVADA DEMOCRATS GET THE BRYAN MULE

Goldfield, Nev., May 29.—Major Minnaseel, the Democratic mule presented to Goldfield by William Jennings Bryan as the district showing the greatest Democratic gains at the last presidential election, today is the object of the admiration of hundreds of Goldfield citizens.

The "major" arrived here late yesterday in charge of a Nebraska university student. He was presented formally to Chairman Laughlin of the Democratic county central committee. The mule was given to Bryan during the campaign by the students of the Minnesota agricultural college.

ROY KNABENSHUE HAS A CLOSE CALL

San Mateo, Cal., May 31.—Due to his own presence of mind and the bravery of George Duesler, his engineer, Aeronaut Roy Knabenshue probably owes his life today.

Knabenshue made an ascent from this city in his dirigible airship late yesterday. At a height of 500 feet two of the cords sustaining the propeller strain snapped. The big craft pitched violently, its prow pointing up at a steep angle. Spectators gazed horror-stricken, momentarily expecting to see the air sailors thrown to the earth.

Bringing around his rudder and balancing the tilting machine, Knabenshue balanced himself, while Duesler crawled past the engine and up the frame toward the steering apparatus. His weight restored the balance, and, after making a round of the enclosure, the airship was brought safely to earth.
