SAYS STORY OF HIS DEATH EXAGGERATED

The following associated dispatch appeared in Sunday Morning's Register:

Spokane, May 29.—Though the body of a murdered man taken from the Spokane river last Wednesday was positively identified by two parties as that of George W. Attebury, a North Dakota farmer, it is now believed that Attebury is alive and well Eugene, Oregon. A letter dated from that point yesterday and signed by him has been received at the Old National bank. The signature is identified by bankers as being genuine.

The dispatch was received too late Saturday night to permit of much investigation, however, the hotel records failing to reveal such a man as registered in the city. But Sunday morning Mr. Attebury appeared in person at the Register office and identified himself as the man supposed to have been murdered.

Mr. Attebury informs this office that he was in Spokane on Saturday, May 22, going to Shoshone, Idaho and from there to Eugene, arriving in this city several days ago, and is the guest of J. S. Moore, the drayman, whom he knew in North Dakota. Attebury went to Spokane from Williston, N. D., his former home. His wife is visiting at Hampden, N. D.

Attebury is an educator and has applied to the local board for a position as teacher in the schools.—Eugene Register.

LEWISTON BANK WAS SHORT \$137,000

[United Press Leased Wire.]

Lewiston, Ida., June 2.—President F. W. Kettnerbach, of the Lewiston National Bank & Idaho Trust Company, is authority for the statement that a shortage of \$137,000 was discovered in the books of the National Bank before its recent consolidation with the Trust Company, and that it has been made good by the directors and shareholders.

The defalcation was found by National Bank Examiner Claud Catch, who after a thorough examination of the books, reported that the alleged embezzlement had covered a period of five years. Two former employees of the Lewiston National Bank are said to have admitted that they knew something concerning the manner in which the money was lost, but the entire affair was kept from the public for obvious reasons.

Now the officials of the bank are ready to proceed with the prosecution, which will be in charge of the government and the surety companies that were on the bonds of the suspected parties. The Lewiston National Bank and the Idaho Trust Company consolidated about a year ago.

"Nobody now connected with the bank had anything to do with the embezzlement," said President Kettnerbach today. "The examination shows that no large amount of money was taken at one time, but that small amounts were embezzled for a period of five years."

BIG RUN OF SALMON IN QUINULT RIVER

A dispatch from Hoquiam, Wash., under date of May 31, says: Never before has there been such a big run of fish in the Quinault river and the Indians find it impossible to keep their nets clear. The run has been so great and the catches so heavy that new nets have been torn almost to shreds. Johnas Hyasman was high boat yesterday, with a catch of 380 salmon. The day's work netted him nearly \$200.
