

ADMIRAL SEBREE WANTS DREADNAUGHTS

[United Press Leased Wire.] Portland, Or., June 7.—Admiral Uriue Sebree, commander of the Pacific coast fleet, who is here by invitation to attend a dinner with Admiral Ijichi, of the Japanese navy, at the Portland Hotel, is so strongly in favor of a larger navy that he declares the construction of at least one battleship of the Dreadnaught class should be started every year.

It would be my plan to build for awhile three or four Dreadnaughts every year, and if we can't do that, we should start one each year. The admiral predicts that the only war we will have with Japan will be of a commercial nature, but added that he recently told Admiral Ijichi that they are now going through a great war—of bangs and fetes.

ACETYLENE BOMBS FOR NAVAL ENGAGEMENTS.

In an editorial in modern methods of warfare, appearing in the June number of Popular Mechanics, H. H. Windsor says: "Now for the next move on the war board. The Germans are experimenting, with reported success, with acetylene shells, which are fired as far as six miles, from a specially constructed gun. These shells are so balanced that upon striking the water, a tube admits the required amount of water to the carbide, producing sufficient acetylene gas to make a light of 3,000 candlepower. By this means a battleship can quickly illuminate an area of several square miles where the enemy is supposed to be. Just what would happen should a ship accidentally fire in a direction opposite the enemy, and thus make a silhouette target of itself, has not been explained.
