WETS WIN FIGHT IN SEATTLE

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Seattle, June 8.—By a decision handed down by the state supreme court in Olympia today, the people of West Seattle have lost their fight to prevent the establishment of saloons on the Sound and bay shore where crowds go for outings on Sundays and at other times during the week.

While West Seattle is especially interested, both the saloon and anti-saloon interests throughout the whole state are affected.

The state supreme court holds that the referendum clause of the city charter as regards saloon or other licenses is void and that the issuing and granting of licenses rests entirely with the city council and regularly designated licensing officers of the city.

WANT UNCLE SAM TO STOP HIS WORK

Marysville, Cal., June 8.—The United States government's settling basin near Marigold was condemned today by the Yuba board of supervisors on the ground that it threatened, if completed, to overflow and flood valuable land beneath it.

The supervisors will demand that construction be stopped and if their demand is unheeded will sue out an injunction to prevent the work being carried on.

NO SEWERS THIS YEAR FOR NORTH SALEM

It is probable that there will be no sewers built in North Salem this year. Two projects costing a great deal of labor and expense on the part of the engineering department have been worked out and defeated by remonstrances.

Chairman Elliott of the sewer committee has worked hard to get some sewers going this year and does not give it up, as he is going to attend the meeting of the North Salem Improvement league tonight and meet the remonstrants.

An elaborate report from Special Engineer Cunningham was submitted on the North Salem sewer system and was referred to the committee on sewers and the city engineer.

Mr. Stolz scored the remonstrants

against sewers in North Salem. He thought it would have a good effect to mail each remonstrant a copy of the health officer's report.
