ALMA BELL ADMITS KILLING HER LOVER

Auburn, Cal., June 9.—Alma Bell, accused of killing her lover, Joseph Arnes, stated today in her cell at the city prison that she was sorry she had fired the fatal shot, and that she wishes she had ended her own life at the same time. Mrs. Fitzgerald, a friend of the girl, testified yesterday at the coroner's inquest, that Miss Bell said, shortly after the shooting that she had fired the shot that killed Arnes.

The inquest corroborated the belief that the girl called for Arnes at his cabin near this city, and asked him to walk with her. Arnes' brothers, Frank and Manuel, testified that soon after the couple left the cabin, they heard two shots, and, rushing outside, found their brother dead. Miss Bell was nowhere in sight.

Attorney Ben C. Tabor has been retained to defend Miss Bell.

TO COMMEMORATE COOS COUNTY COLONY OF 1849

Myrtle Point Enterprise: A half century ago last Saturday, the 29th day of May, the first colony of settlers landed in the Coquille valley and made preparations to make this their home. There were 45 members of the colony and the majority of them have made this beautiful valley their home during all the years that followed. The colony came from Baltimore, Maryland, and was headed by Dr. Hermann, who homesteaded on the South Fork, where T. M. Herman now resides. It is now planned to celebrate this half century anniversary this fall with an old settlers' picnic at the Hermann homestead, with a program to extend over several days. The plans for the celebration are yet incomplete, but it is proposed to make it an occasion that will long be remembered. Many of the members of the colony have passed away, but a number survive, and they and their descendants are enjoying the opportunities that were discerned by the wise ones who first chose this as an ideal home place. Among those of the original colony who survive are James Burke, Alex. Stauff, August Schroeder, Fred Schroeder, T. M. Hermann, Hinger Hermann and Mrs. E. Bender.
