KLAMATH FALLS TO CELEBRATE COMPLETION OF HER RAILROAD

INDIANS IN WAR PAINT, COW BOYS AND STAGE COACHES IN PARADE-- BIG BARBECUE, WATER CARNIVAL AT NIGHT EXCURSIONS ON THE LAKE AND GENERAL JOY

Klamath Falls will celebrate the completion of her railroad next Monday, June 14. There will be an old-fashioned barbecue on the famous Hot Springs tract, a ball game between two Indian teams, one from Chemawa and the other from the Klamath Indian school. The Pacific coast tennis tournament, lasting three days.

There will also be a historical parade with Indians in war paint, cowboys in costume, pack trains and freighters, stage coaches and all the old-time conveyances, and the modern auto. There will be a prize trap-shooting contest, in which some of

the best shots on the coast will participate, excursion on the upper lake and a ride on the new "smoke wagons." There will also be a grand water carnival at night on the beautiful lake, Ewauna, the finest spectacle ever seen in the Inland Empire. It will be a greedy visitor indeed who will long for more when the Klamath Falls people get through with him. Excursions will be run from Sacramento and San Francisco and a big one from Portland.

RESTAURANT AND HOTEL PRIVILEGES STILL BARRED

TEN ALDERMEN TIED ON MATTER THAT HAS JUST BEEN VOTED DOWN OVERWHELMINGLY AT PORTLAND

Ten city fathers responded to roll call last night. Alderman Moores rose to a question of personal privilege, saying it had been incorrectly reported that his committee was holding up a bill. The record would show that the ordinance committee had reported adversely on the ordinance permitting hotels and restaurants to serve liquors with meals, May 24, and the report was adopted. The recorder's books showed that Mr. Moores' statement was correct, as he claimed.

Mr. Greenbaum questioned the record, saying that, at his request, the bill had gone over until the member who introduced it could be present. Citizens interested in the ordinance were present, and claim this action was taken. It was upon this information that Mr. Hofer had asked that the bill be reported from the ordinance committee. The adverse report on the bill was not signed by Mr. Moores, as chairman of the ordinance committee, but was signed by Messrs. Eldridge and Moffitt. This is published in the interest of justice to Mr. Moores.

Mr. Waters moved that the vote by which the adverse report was adopted be reconsidered.

Mayor Rodgers ruled that the vote killing the bill without discussion could be reconsidered. On vote being taken the record was:

To reconsider—Elliott, Greenbaum, Hofer, Stoltz, Waters, 5.

Against reconsideration—Eldridge, Hill, Presnall, Moores, Sauter, 5.

The vote being a tie, Mayor Rodgers cast his vote in the negative, defeating reconsideration.

Mr. Hofer gave notice that he would reintroduce the bill at the next meeting of the council.

An ordinance to allow the Portland Railway, Light & Power Co. to vacate 350 feet of its track at the state fair grounds, and enter the same on state lands. Read twice and referred to ordinance committee.

Ordinances were read and passed, establishing grades, adopting plans and specifications and ordering improvements on Broadway street, on North Sixth street, Market street and Hood street, with six inches of gravel and four inches of crushed rock.

Mr. Stoltz said he hoped there would be no remonstrances to these improvements. He did not believe a man's life would be safe who would sign a remonstrance, such as the spirit of progress. He wanted to

know if this was the proper time to notify the Oregon Electric that they must lower their tracks on Broadway. Mayor Rodgers said it was, and the recorder was instructed to notify that corporation. Mr. Hill said that the people wanted these improvements, and the Oregon Electric had promised to make a proper compliance with the city's grade. He expressed the hope that they would do so.

Bill of A. L. Fraser for repairs on city hall was referred to committee on public buildings.

Bill of J. F. Goode for \$100 for damages sustained on defective sidewalk on north side of Asylum avenue referred to city attorney.

Council adjourned to meet Monday evening at 8 p. m.

STANFORD REFUSES TO RECOGNIZE UNION LABOR

[United Press Leased Wire.] Stanford University, Cal., June 9.—It is feared here that the policy of "open shop" declared by the superintendent of construction for the work of rebuilding the university structures destroyed by the earthquake of April 18, 1906, may result in a repetition of the labor troubles prevalent here some time ago.

Yesterday evening the union painters employed on the campus were laid off by the superintendent for refusing to give up their Saturday half-holiday, and work under the "open shop" standard.

Much structural steel work necessarily will have to be done, and as the structural steel work in this section is controlled practically by the union men, the result of the decision of the superintendent to have the work done under the "open shop" conditions will be watched with interest.

Remonstrances may be filed in the manner and within the time provided by law.

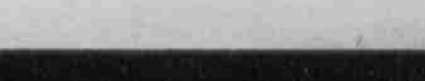
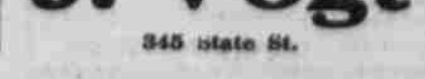
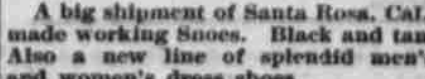
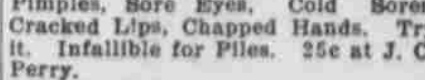
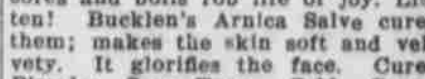
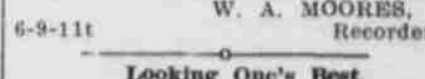
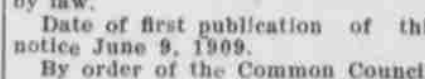
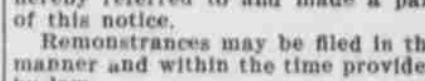
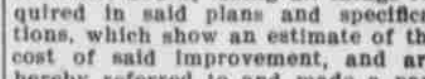
