LEG WAS BROKEN IN STREET CAR COLLISION

 Portland, Or., June 10.—Motorman G. S. Shattuck was fatally injured, two street cars were partially demolished, and a score of passengers were shaken up shortly after midnight this morning in a head-on collision between a Union avenue car and one on the Woodlawn line. Shattuck, who was driving a Union avenue car, had been employed by the street car company but a short time. It is supposed that when he saw the other car coming he lost his reasoning power, and shot his charge ahead, instead of reversing the current. Instantly after the accident occurred he was buried under a shower of glass. His leg was broken and it is thought his skull was fractured.

THE LIQUOR PROBLEM BOTHERS STANFORD

 Stanford University, June 10.—The liquor question, cause of the student demonstrations and threatened strike a year ago that resulted in the suspension of a number of Stanford undergraduates, threatens to break out anew when the university opens its doors for the fall term in August. Charlie Meyers, purveyor of liquid refreshment to Stanford students for more than a decade, is said to have completed plans for opening another booze emporium midway between Mayfield and Mountainview, half an hour's walk from the campus. By stringent liquor laws Meyers has been driven successfully out of Mayfield and Menlo Park, but his student trade in the past has been so lucrative that he has been said to have paid \$20,000 for the new resort that will open with the college term.

COAL DEALERS FIGHT PRICE COMES DOWN

 San Francisco, June 10.—Austral coal was reduced in price by wholesalers here today from \$9 to \$7.50 a ton, as the result of a bitter feud which has broken out between the Western Coal Company and the Pacific Coal Company.

The latter concern slashed prices today and it is understood that retailers will reduce their rate from \$12 to \$10.

The price cutting wholesalers explain that they will strive to stimulate the summer trade and that they are also helped in reducing prices by the fact that it now costs less to import coal than heretofore.

NEW ROAD WILL RUN TRAINS FROM SEATTLE

 Seattle, Wash., June 10.—On June 14 the first Chicago, Milwaukee & Puget Sound train schedule will go into effect, covering the first three divisions out of Seattle. The schedule calls only for a double train service, a daily passenger, Sunday excepted, and a thrice-a-week second-class freight and passenger train.

It will be several months before anything like a fast schedule will be inaugurated.

MISER HAD \$50,000 BURIED IN CELLAR

 San Francisco, June 10.—With \$50,000 buried in the cellar of his house, Henry Kissane, brother of the late Rueben H. Lloyd, lawyer, lived in a refugee shack until it was torn down by the health authorities.

The story of Kissane's fortune was told by him in court late yesterday in connection with the settlement of the Lloyd estate. Kissane, who is 79 years old, said that he earned the money in the teaming business and that shortly after the fire he had his brother dig up part of the fortune and invest it for him. His claim against the estate amounts to about \$32,000.

Kissane declared that he was nearly caught once by the failure of a bank in which he had deposited \$10,000 and that since that time he has been his own banker.

SMUGGLED CHINAMEN IN DINING CAR ICE BOX

Chicago, June 10.—That an ice box compartment in Pullman dining cars were convenient and popular receptacles for contraband Chinese who wished to enter this country from Mexico was revealed today by supplementary testimony in the United States district court when Bob Leung, a rich Chinese of El Paso, Texas, and two Mexicans are on trial charged with violating United States immigration laws.

The ice box route, however, became unpopular when one Chinese was suffocated in a refrigerator. Albert Hampton, a cook, who was a witness, described the smuggling of Chinese as follows:

"A ice box in the dining car was four feet long, two and a half feet wide and eight feet deep. The closet in the car in which the linen was carried was four and a half feet long, two feet deep and one and a half feet wide. We carried lots of Chinamen in these two places all the way from El Paso to Chicago.

"On one occasion Stephenson (he is a railway brakeman who was indicted for complicity in the alleged Chinese smuggling game) said to me: 'You'll have to find some other way of carrying those Chinamen. They won't ride in the ice box any more. They are afraid since one of them was smothered to death.'"

Rather a rough commentary on our civilization that white women are too tough for Chinese to live with.
