

INITIATE REFUSED TO SALUTE THE FLAG

[United Press Leased Wire.]
San Francisco, June 11.—William R. Hickey, candidate for initiation into the Woodmen of the World, was ejected unceremoniously from the lodge rooms of a local camp Tuesday evening for refusing to salute the Stars and Stripes, according to a report that is current in fraternal circles here today.

When Hickey was told to salute the flag, he is said to have replied: "I will not salute that rag."

Cool heads among the lodge members prevented the general indignation from finding violent expression, and Hickey was merely ordered from the hall. He claimed that he was

beaten some years ago by a company of New York militia that carried a flag, and since then he has not owed allegiance to the country or to its emblem.
