MINDANAO FILIPINOS IN REVOLT

Manila, June 14.—Entrenched in a mountain retreat defying capture, a native sergeant and 22 Visayans, privates in the Philippines Constabulary, who mutinied at Davao, Mindanao Island, June 6, are making efforts today to enlist the aid of other Filipinos in starting a revolt. A company of constabulary is en route to Davao today, following the receipt of news of the mutiny and a company of the Twenty-third Infantry is already on the scene guarding the town.

Reports that an American named Libbey was killed in a battle with the mutineers have not been confirmed. The deserters are known to be among the most dangerous natives in the constabulary and a serious clash is anticipated when the troops overtake them. The authorities are determined to capture every one of the mutineers and have ordered the pursuers not to abandon the chase until this is accomplished.

Major-General William P. Duvals, commanding the government of the Philippines, reported today that his faith in the native constabulary was not shaken by the mutiny at Davao and that he still retained the highest regard for the general loyalty of the forces.

Brigadier-General Harry H. Bandholtz, chief of the constabulary, who is in the field, was notified today of the mutiny and sent word that he would hurry to the scene and take personal command of the pursuing forces.

TOWN OF CALIENTE DESTROYED BY FIRE

Bakersfield, Cal., June 14.—Almost every building in the mountain village of Caliente, 24 miles east of this city, is in ashes as the result of a stubborn fire that swept the town late yesterday afternoon and last night.

The work of a brigade of amateur fire-fighters was made extremely hazardous by the presence of three thousand pounds of dynamite in the Southern Pacific warehouse, where the fire started.

When the dynamite exploded, the depot and other adjacent buildings were wrecked, and the fire spread quickly. It continued unchecked until it burned itself out.

Telegraphic communication with Los Angeles was interrupted, and a full report of the disaster cannot be obtained. It is reported that no lives were lost and that the property loss will reach \$60,000.

Heretofore, the only way farm products were taken to market was by wagon. A special train carrying three hundred California excursionists arrived here at 7:30 o'clock last night. Another train with persons from various parts of Oregon aboard also arrived to help make this great event in the city's history a success in every way.

ABANDONS SEARCH FOR MISSING HUSBAND

Roseburg, Ore., June 14.—Despairing of ever seeing her husband alive again, Mrs. M. Porteous of Los Angeles, Cal., has abandoned what she declares to be a hopeless search for him.

Edward J. Porteous was a well known Rogue River mining man. He disappeared from Grants Pass under circumstances that indicate murder, according to Detective J. H. Delamonte, who came here from Los Angeles to assist in the search. Mrs. Porteous has spent three days in the vicinity of West Fork, where her husband was interested in mining enterprises, but found no trace of him. She now thinks, as Detective Delamonte does, that Porteous was killed by enemies and his body concealed.
