San Rafael, Cal., June 14.—Hugo Chance, a young mining engineer of the city, today is rejoicing over the expected acquisition of a fortune

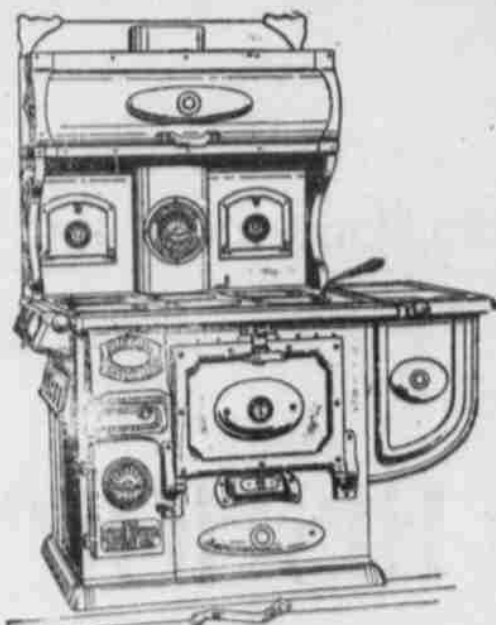

DISTRICT TERRORIZED BY WILD TRIBESMEN

TABRIZ, Persia, June 14.—In response to the appeals of the residents of this city, several detachments of Russian troops, heavily armed and equipped with machine guns, left today to protect the territory from further ravages of the Shakshevan tribesmen.

Reports that reached this city late yesterday told tales of horrors that are being committed by the plainsmen, and it is said that 5000 persons have been put to death. The Urmlah district is reported to be at the mercy of the raiders and can be saved only by the intervention of the Russians.

For several weeks the czar's troops have been encamped near the Persian frontier, holding themselves in readiness in case of such an outbreak. Their presence is reported to have been distasteful to many Persians and foreign residents and late last week a copy of a petition, supposed to have been drawn by European residents for a Persian society, was forwarded to every consular representative of a foreign power at Teheran, asking the recall of the Russians.

The outcome of the outbreak of the Shakshevan is awaited with anxiety in this city and at the capital.

SEE THE FINE HAND OF CHICAGO PACKERS

Liverpool, June 14.—Wholesale meat dealers and officials of the Liverpool Meat Traders' Association see in the falling off of cattle importations from the United States and Canada, grave danger of a beef famine. Two or three weeks ago the weekly importations at Birkenhead averaged 5000 head of cattle. Of late this figure has decreased to 2000, while last week's supply was but 800.

An official of the Liverpool association said today:

"I am inclined to attribute the present shortage to the tactics of American shippers. Knowing that a famine is imminent, I believe they are holding back their cattle for an increased price. I have been informed also that much frozen meat is stored in refrigerators throughout the country, being held for a higher market. The Liverpool Chamber of Commerce is urging the government to remove the embargo of live cattle from Argentina. This may be a solution to the threatening problem."

A telegram from the Liverpool association has been received by the president of the board of agriculture asking an investigation of conditions.
