### UNCLE SAM CUTS SOME LUMBER AS WELL AS ICE

[United Press Leased Wire.]

Seattle, Wash., June 15.—According to advance figures received by the Pacific Coast Lumber Trade Journal from the forest service at Washington, D. C., this state led all others in the production of rough and finished lumber during 1908. The total cut for the state, as indicated in the report, was 2,915,928,000 feet, as against 2,722,421,000 feet cut in Louisiana during the year.

The production for the year in Washington, however, fell off from the previous year and the cut was more than two billion feet less than in 1906, the biggest year in the history of the lumber industry in this state.

The total production of lumber in the United States for 1908 was 32,289,369,000 feet, which represents a falling off from the previous year of 6,966,785,000 feet.
