THOUGHT HE WAS DRUNK BUT BACK WAS BROKEN

[United Press Leased Wire.] Oakland, Cal., June 15.—John F. Keffer, an aged retired grocer, is hovering between life and death today after lying ill and neglected in a cell in the city prison here for 48 hours. It is thought that Keffer's back is broken or dislocated and little hope for his recovery is entertained.

Keffer was arrested for drunkenness Saturday afternoon. His name was stricken from the docket yesterday morning and it was believed that he had been released. Through some mistake the aged man was left in his cell until last night when relatives notified the police that he had disappeared.

Investigation proved that he had not been set free and he was found lying in a semi-conscious condition on the floor of his cell. Food which had been placed in his cell was untouched and a physician who examined the aged man said that he had sustained a serious injury to the back.

FAST TRAIN FROM SEATTLE TO FRISCO

Seattle, Wash., June 15.—Beginning June 20, a solid through Pullman train service will be inaugurated between San Francisco and Seattle, over the Southern Pacific and Northern Pacific railroad lines. The service will be under the direction of the Union Pacific, which recently entered into an agreement with the Hill line to handle business jointly from Portland to Tacoma.

The train will be known as the Shasta Limited and will leave San Francisco at 6 p. m., arriving at Portland the next evening and Seattle and Tacoma the following morning. The south-bound train will leave Seattle at 8 o'clock a. m., arriving at San Francisco at 9:15 p. m. the following day.

SENT BROTHER TO PEN BUT DODGES HIMSELF

[United Press Leased Wire.] Oakland, Cal., June 15.—Determined to prevent, if possible, his confession being used against him by the prosecution, John Claudiano, accused of dynamiting the Schenck home in East Oakland, in an effort to kill former Supervisor James L. Gallagher of San Francisco, is making preparations today for his trial next Friday.

John's brother Peter was convicted of the same crime and sentenced to life imprisonment. The chief evidence used against him was his confession, augmented by that of his brother. John is determined to fight against the use of these confessions in his case and the outcome of the case will depend largely upon the result of the fight on that point.

OREGON WILL HAVE THE BEST CROPS

According to G. B. Lanham, purchasing agent for Wagner & Co., a commission firm of Chicago, Oregon fruit crop prospects are a shade better this year than most of the other fruit growing states. Mr. Lanham has been making a tour of the fruit growing districts in the north and middle west and states that the Colorado crop was saved this year by the use of heating pots kept going there for a week or ten days during the period when the late spring frost came. In Oregon Mr. Lanham looks for an average crop of apples, with peaches and cherries short. He visited the big strawberry growing section in the south and southwest before starting on his western trip, and says the berries this year hit the high mark for prices and looks for one of the best berry seasons in a number of years. The market for box apples as packed and put up in the northwest and particularly at Hood River, Mr. Lanham says, is expanding more rapidly than it can be supplied and he looks for a greater demand for them this year than ever before.

Where samples are required and not furnished by bidders, the articles must be equal to samples seen at the asylum, and the bids will be assumed to have been made on basis of samples. All goods must be in strict accordance with sample in original package, if possible, and delivered at the insane asylum within 20 days after contract is awarded. Bids must be in blank form, which will be furnished, together with instructions to bidders, by the clerk, upon application. Each bid on flour or meat must be accompanied by a certified check for \$300, and each bid on fish by a certified check of \$75, and all other bids by certified checks equal to 10 per cent of the amount of the bid; checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned immediately and those accepted when the contract is completed. Bids must be enclosed in sealed envelopes and directed to the undersigned, and plainly marked on the outside, "Bids for Asylum Supplies," and the class of goods should also be inscribed on the envelope. Price, fitness and quality being equal, preference will be given to articles manufactured, grown or produced in this state, when a particular article is specifically called for, bids for other kind or manufacturer, or brand equally as good will be entertained, but to insure recognition of such bids, samples of the articles it is proposed to supply must accompany them. The board reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to accept or reject any part of a bid. Bids will be opened at the executive chambers, in the state capitol, at Salem, Oregon, at 3 p. m. on Tuesday, July 6, 1909. Auditing officers are hereby prohibited from confirming accounts of purchasers which do not comply with section 2460, chapter X, title XXIV of Bellinger and Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Oregon. 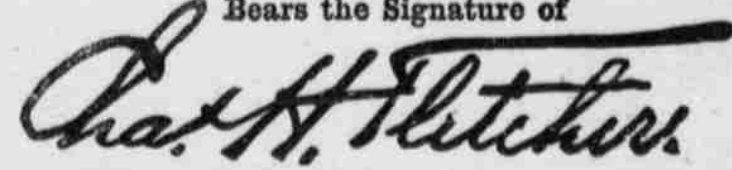
