## West Salem as a Railroad Center

With the completion of the Falls City & Dallas railroad this summer, with the immediate operation of freight and passenger trains, it is of interest to the public to know what connections can be made through West Salem.

Direct connection will be had with all the important towns on the West Side from Corvallis to Portland.

From West Salem you can go by rail to Newport, Corvallis, McMinnville, Hillsboro, Portland, Sheridan, McCoy, Monmouth, Independence and many other smaller towns along the lines of the Falls City & Dallas, Monmouth & Independence and S. P. railroads. As all trade and commerce gravitate towards the larger towns.

West Salem will tan the entire West Side Country between Corvallis and Portland. There is an immense territory of business lying across the river which will feed West Salem. WHY? For the reason that Salem is the Capital City, the second largest in Oregon, with a population of nearly 20,000 and has direct connection with the east side lines of the S. P., the Oregon Electric and Willamette river.

The building of eight miles of city lines in Salem.

For the Eugene & Eastern and its extensions south to Eugene and the construction of the Salem-Mehama line will make a heavy railroad center out of Salem.

THE UNITED RAILWAYS SYSTEM, built out of Portland to Hillsboro, IS NOW BUILDING INTO WEST SALEM.

With these lines what will Salem and West Salem be as railroad centers? The West Salem railroad will immediately change the course of travel from the round-about methods of the rail and the long drives by team into as rapid and easy methods of travel by rail as we enjoy on the east side of the river. The entire west side territory will be routed through the Falls City & Dallas railroad, terminating at West Salem.

Look at your map and see for yourself what will happen the moment the first train leaves West Salem.

The Independence and Monmouth Railway

Will secure trackage over the Falls City & Dallas railroad, which will bring two railroad companies into West Salem direct. West side lines of travel will be popular.

### What of West Salem?

The grading crew will finish its work within TWO WEEKS at West Salem. Track laying from Dallas is progressing rapidly and will be in West Salem in about 60 days. The grading crew, after completing the main line grade, will immediately lay out and grade the terminal yards.

A Depot will be erected on Second street

For passengers, the freight being handled from the terminal yards and wharf. The railroad company will issue a schedule of time tables as soon as the road is completed and general traffic will be open to the public, introducing into Salem through West Salem, connections by rail with all the important towns on the west side, reaching from Portland to Corvallis, and from Newport to Sheridan.

### A Gasoline Launch Service

Will be inaugurated between Salem and West Salem upon the opening of the road, meeting all trains at a low fare. Boats will leave foot of State street and land at Waters' Wharf at West Salem. A regular service will be maintained to take care of business between trains meets. River steamers will also land at West Salem for freight and passenger business.

## PRIMARY LAW IS KILLED

Springfield, Ill., June 16.—The supreme court of Illinois today declared unconstitutional the state primary law, and as a result the state is without a legal method of nominating candidates for office. It is thought that a special session of the legislature will be called to enact a new law.

The decision of the supreme court is a result of an attack made upon the primary law by candidates defeated in the state primaries last summer.

The law was declared unconstitutional on the ground that it did not provide registration days for those cities that, previously, had adopted election laws requiring voters to register a stated number of days before an election.

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## FAME FOR DR. LOTZ OF ORTING

### CURES CONTAGIOUS DISEASES IN AN HOUR

Dr. Lotz, mayor of Orting, Wash., has received notice from the United States Marine hospital at Washington, D. C., that his treatment for contagious diseases is being investigated.

The treatment discovered by Dr. Lotz, it is claimed, will eliminate scarlet fever, smallpox, blood poison and similar diseases from the human system in from 30 minutes to an hour, leaving the patient in usual health.

Tests have been made in which smallpox was eliminated in from 55 to 70 minutes, scarlet fever in an hour and a half, blood poison in an hour and malaria in 20 to 30 minutes.

Dr. Lotz expects to be called to Washington to assist in the experiments to be made by the government with his discovery.

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
