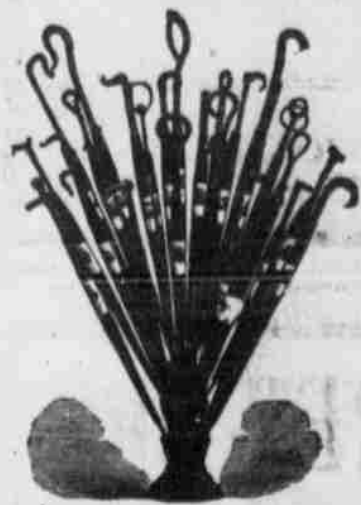

Notice is hereby given that the common council of the city of Salem deems it expedient to improve and proposes to improve at the expense of abutting and adjacent property, Broadway street in the city of Salem, Oregon, from the north line of the bridge over North Mill creek on said Broadway street to the north line of Madison street, by grading the roadway of said portion of said street and by placing thereon gravel and crushed rock and rolling the same with a steam roller; all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications adopted by the common council on the 8th day of June, 1909, and now on file in the office of the city recorder, and by doing all things required in said plans and specifications, which show an estimate of the cost of said improvement and are hereby referred to and made a part of this notice.

FASHION GOSSIP FROM NEW YORK

Artistic Picture Hats Fast Replacing the Absurd Shapes—Bronze Shoes the Latest Fad—New Princess Effects.

Ladies who have become intensely weary of the latest Paris fashion absurdities in the way of hats such as the ubiquitous peach basket shape which is really becoming to nobody, will welcome with a sigh of relief the very latest millinery fad in the all-black hat which has been found harmonizes beautifully with the fashionable shades for frocks, particularly the popular rose colored gowns.

Bronze Slippers Fashionable. Bronze shoes, slippers and ties are the newest thing in footwear invented by Fashion, if that can be called new which is, after all, but a revival of an old style.

The bronze kid appears in many forms, pumps with jaunty ribbon bows, strap slippers, high button boots and low cut ties. This new kind of footwear can be used for many purposes, but is intended primarily for dressy wear.

Coleur De Rose. Rose color is having a tremendous popularity this summer, appearing as it does not only in dresses, coats and wraps, but also in millinery, parasols, veils, purses and other accessories. In millinery especially rose color is all the rage. Rose pink straw is trimmed with flowers and ribbons of exactly the same shade, and both white and black straws are also trimmed with this popular color.

Elaborate displays of leather goods in the new pastel shades have lately attracted especial attention in the New York shops, and here too rose color has taken precedence.

New Ideas in Frocks.

All the latest models in pongee or linen gowns show effective variations of the new long waist line. This is seen not only in princess dresses, but also in coat suits, the skirts of the latter being cut with a deep hip yoke, below which the material is box-pleated or set on in circular style. The newest princess frocks have a fitted cuirass effect, extending well below the hips, and below this are box-pleats or a gathered flounce effect.

The Indispensable Brassiere.

The brassiere is no less indispensable as her corset to every woman who pays any attention to the fit of her gowns. A properly made brassiere holds and moulds the figure above the corset, bearing all the strain which otherwise stretches and wears the dress waist, and also preventing the ugly line at the top of the corset which often shows so distressingly across the back of the bodice.

A new style brassiere that closes in front has three small cross bones at the side of the bust which prevent the figure from spreading and secure the fashionable trimness of line. In the back closing, surplice brassiere, there is a new model, made with a reinforcing shield under the arm, which helps both the shape and year of the garment. Lovely Summer Frocks.

A very pretty, but by no means expensive, summer frock is made of rose colored linen, or one of the heavy cotton fabrics closely imitating linen. It is cut with the front panel extending down to the feet in princess style, but the side panels are cut off about half way below the hips and lengthened by a deep side pleating of the material that ex-

tends from each side of the front panel around to the back. The neck is cut out in a small square to display a lace guimpe. A touch of braiding in pink soutache outlines the square neck, trims the sleeves above long lace cuffs and heads the pleated flounce effect.

Variety of Styles. An immense variety of materials are used for summer frocks. Pongee is enormously popular, so also is linen, batiste, Marquise, cotton voile, chambray and that extremely useful fabric, foulard. The revival of foulard comes as a boon to woman-kind. It is used for everything from plain morning frocks to elaborate afternoon gowns and in light shades even for dancing dresses.

Election of School Directors

WOMAN TRIED TODAY

The case of the city of Salem against Hattie McGinnis, Rose Leland, Emma Thomas and Julia Downing was introduced in the city recorder's court this morning before Judge Wiley A. Moore and a demurrer to the complaint was argued by attorneys for the defendants, Kaiser & Pogue and Carson & Brown, and City Attorney Keyes and Assistant City Attorney Heltzel for the city.

After an extensive argument by counsel for the defendants on the demurrer on the grounds there was not sufficient cause contained in the complaint to constitute a cause of action and the citation by attorneys for both defendants and plaintiffs of numerous authorities, Judge Moore overruled the demurrer and the case was continued until 2 o'clock this afternoon. Before the demurrer was argued, the respective attorneys made a verbal agreement that but one case would be tried, that being the charge of vagrancy against Emma Thomas, and the remainder of the cases should abide by the decision of the courts rendered in the Thomas case. This was done to expedite matters, and owing to the four cases being identical.

According to the arguments of the attorneys for the city, any individual entering a house of ill-fame more than one time, whether or not he be possessed of millions, can be charged as a common vagrant under the ordinance. The arguments of Attorneys Kaiser & Pogue and Carson to the demurrer were in substance as follows:

That the defendants cannot be accused of vagrancy when they are property owners, residents of Salem and pay taxes.

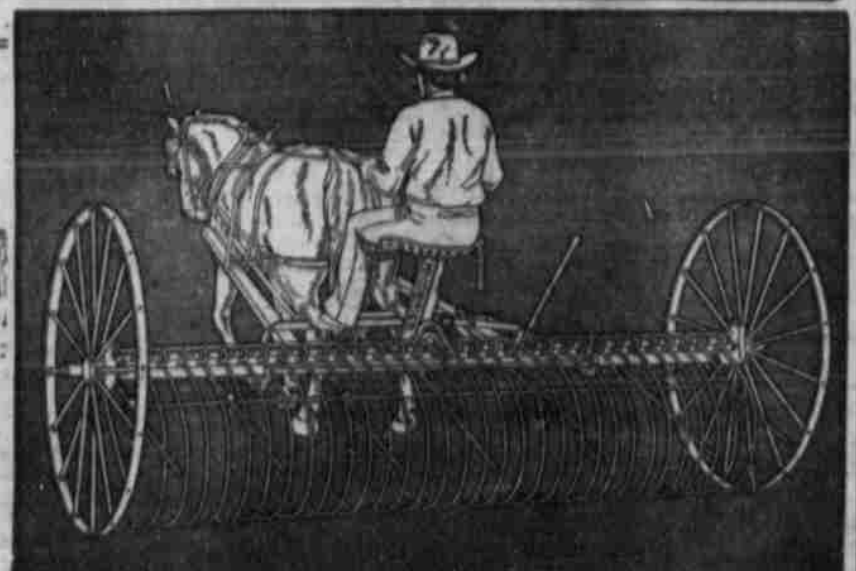
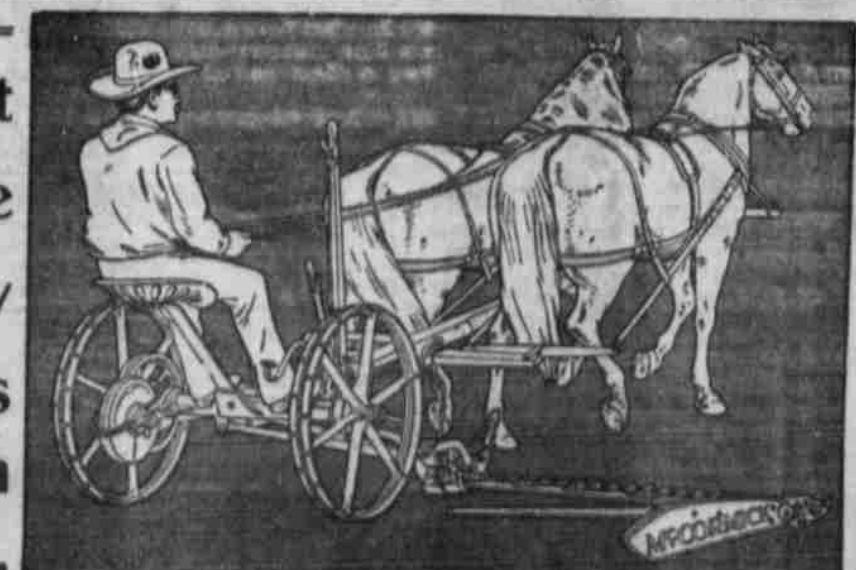
The complaint does not show cause sufficient to constitute a crime for the reason there is nothing to show that the defendants are unable to procure some employment for earning a livelihood.

In connection with the above points counsel for the defendants cited decisions of the higher courts whereby reversals had been rendered in cases in which direct evidence to show a positive commission of crime was absent.

In answer to the argument by the defendant's counsel, City Attorney Keyes and Assistant Heltzel quoted the ordinance upon which the charge is brought. The ordinance now in effect in this city providing for vagrancy tends to show that should any person live in, frequent or inhabit a house of ill-fame, tipping house or houses, bawdy house or houses, in any continuous manner, is guilty of vagrancy. The ordinance in effect covering the same crime heretofore was then referred to by City Attorney Keyes. This was in the case of City vs. Nichols, where Nichols was convicted of vagrancy and the case was carried to the supreme court, where it was affirmed. The ordinance covering vagrancy at that time was read by counsel for the city and the wording was nearly the same with the exception of the words "houses."
