HURT IN STAGE WRECK PLUNGE THIRTY FEET OVER BANK NEAR HEALTH RESORT

(United Press Leased Wire.)
St. Helena, Cal., June 18.—S. S. Barnard, sales manager of the St. Helena factory, and his wife, are near death from injuries sustained when the sanatorium stage pitched over a high embankment late yesterday, and plunged 30 feet down the mountain side.

Barnard is suffering from concussion of the brain, and his skull is thought to be fractured. Mrs. Barnard's jaw was broken in three places, and her right shoulder fractured. She also received internal injuries.

Others who were injured are: J. N. Denison, stage driver; shoulder dislocated, internal injuries; Mrs. K. C. Gordon, of Nampa; internal injuries.

Mrs. R. Albera, San Francisco; internal injuries.

George Taylor, the 12-year-old son of the chaplain of the sanatorium, was bruised severely when he jumped from the stage as it plunged over the precipice.

The accident happened within 100 yards of the sanatorium, and the injured were cared for by the physicians and nurses there. Grave fears for the lives of Barnard and his wife are felt.

Two Complaints Filed.
Two complaints have been filed in the circuit court. Martha A. Woodward against Fred E. Woodward, a suit to dissolve the marriage contract on the grounds of cruel and inhuman treatment. The Peimers Realty Company vs. Wilhelm von Boselager et al. This is also an equity suit filed by the plaintiff asking the court to issue an order compelling the defendants to appear in court and show on what grounds they claim an interest in certain property in section 34, township 5, south range 1 west. Attorneys Venzel & Venzel appear as attorneys for the plaintiffs.
