MRS. MARY WADE IS 106 YEARS OLD

Mrs. Mary Wade, centenarian, passed through Bandon last week en route to her son's place in this county, where she will make her future home. Mrs. Wade was 106 years old June 4. Her son James Laird died in Coos county a few weeks ago at the age of 87. Walter Laird, another son, is living above Bandon on the Quillike, and two daughters, Mary Ann Sargeant and Jane Hoag, are living at Grants Pass. Mrs. Wade's maiden name was Calhoun. She was born near Perth, Scotland, and came to Canada with her father when four years old. Her first husband was John Laird, by whom she had eight children, three still living.

Mrs. Wade has been a typical pioneer woman, residing several years in Utah, thence for some time in California and from there settling in Coos county. For many years she and her husband conducted the Laird station on the stage road between Roseburg and Marshfield.

More recently she has been making her home with her daughter in Del Norte, Cal., but when her daughter moved to Grants Pass she expressed a desire to return to the old home in Oregon, so a grand daughter and a grand son made the trip to bring her, a distance of 165 miles. Mrs. Wade stayed at the A. D. Morse home and was up for the early morning boat to Coquille. While here she was visited by a number of relatives in this city.—Bandon Record.

AN OIL STRIKE IS REPORTED

We are informed a strike has been made at the Malheur well and that oil is there. The quantity isn't sufficient for commercial purposes, but the flow is increasing and they expect to strike a gusher at any moment. This proves beyond any doubt there is oil in the field here and the only question seeming to be of any importance is how soon will it be before we strike the gushers. The three companies now drilling are all highly elated over the prospects and each is confident of striking oil in paying commercial quantities at any time. We have had faith in this field to a great extent, but we feel almost certain that there is plenty of oil here now if we go down deep enough to get it. Oil stock has taken quite an active stand and several sales have been made in Vale this week of shares. This shows a confidential tone at home and where local people are willing to stake their money on a proposition there is no wildcatting in the field. There is oil here and those who expect to reap the harvest had best enter the field early.—Oregon Oriano.

FEAR HE LOST HIS WAY AND FELL OVER CLIFF

(United Press Leased Wire.) Yosemite, Cal., June 18.—Guests and employes of Camp Curry, aided by a detachment of United States soldiers, are searching for F. P. Shepherd, who disappeared yesterday while on an excursion to Glacier Point. A dense fog has overhung the valley for the last 18 hours, and it is feared that he fell off a cliff in the darkness.

In company with a party of ladies started for Glacier Point yesterday. Because of the fog and mist the ladies stopped at Sentinel Dome, while Shepherd pushed on. He did not return during the night and searching parties were sent out early today.

DYNAMITED THE HOME OF S. P. SUPERINTENDENT

(United Press Leased Wire.) Tucson, Ariz., June 18.—With a roar that awakened every resident of the city, a charge of dynamite placed under the home of W. H. Whalen, division superintendent of the Southern Pacific, exploded early this morning. Whalen and his wife, by chance, were sleeping in an outside dormitory in the cupola of their home, and although buried in debris, following a collapse of the tower, escaped death.

Following the explosion the wrecked building caught fire, and in a race between the flames and the local fire department to rescue the "imprisoned victim," the firemen won by a narrow margin.

USE LOCAL PAPERS FOR DISTRIBUTION

A new policy regarding the attainment of publicity for La Grande was begun at last night's meeting of the Commercial club when it was decided to use the local papers for distribution among homeowners. The plan is to buy from each paper weekly subscriptions to the amount of \$10 and send prospective settlers whose letters seem to warrant it one of the papers for a period of three months. This will give the club an opportunity to furnish 800 inquirers with ordinary every-day unvarnished information regarding our city and our resources that could be given by no reasonable amount of letter writing.

While specially prepared booklets, circulars and other commonly used means of advertising a community are good, there is always the danger of giving the recipients of such matter the feeling that our drawbacks are glossed over and our advantages exaggerated. Every day happenings, facts about our crops, or fruit shipments, and in our civic life are told in every issue of the local papers, and readers will feel that they are getting the truth, plain and unvarnished. If, therefore, they decide to come to this section, they will do so with the intention of staying.—LaGrande Observer.
