EXPEDITION TO STUDY ALASKA'S GLACIERS

[United Press Leased Wire.] Seattle, Wash., June 22.—The first expedition ever sent out by the National Geological Society of Washington, D. C., to study the big glaciers of Alaska, is scheduled to sail from Seattle on the steamer Portland next Thursday, to remain in Alaska pursuing scientific investigations until the latter part of September.

The expedition will be headed by Professor R. S. Tarr, of Cornell University, and Professor Lawrence Martin, of the University of Wisconsin, two of the most noted scientists in America.

W. B. Lewis, of the United States geological survey, will accompany the party as topographer.

In speaking of the purpose of the expedition today, Professor Tarr said: "The big glaciers of Alaska have been undergoing some unusual and last few years, and moving around considerably, so the National Geological Society appropriated \$5000 to fit out an expedition to go to Alaska and study them, and to determine, if possible, the cause for their changed conditions and positions."

ALASKAN DAM BREAKS DOING MUCH DAMAGE

[United Press Leased Wire.] Skagway, Alaska, June 22.—By the breaking of the dam of the North Columbia Gold Mining Company at Surprise Lake, in the Atlin district, on Thursday, the big bridge of the British-American Dredging Company was wrecked by the great wall of water which swept through the valley, a sawmill was washed away and many of the houses were carried off. The total damage is estimated at nearly \$100,000.
