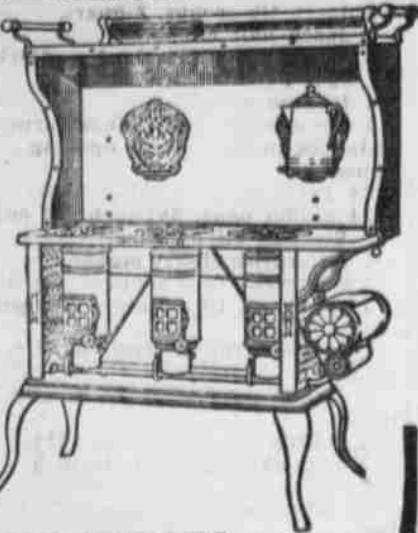

Billy Taylor Writes.

Seattle, June 18.

"Colonel E. Hoyer,

"Salem, Oregon.

"I am just in receipt of your papers and I assure you they are very much appreciated. They are the first papers from home that I have seen since I got here and they will be read with pleasure by many people. This has been a great day for the Oregon people at the exposition. Our building was dedicated and turned over to the Washington commission. There was an immense crowd at the building and the Oregon people surely did themselves great honor. Samples can be seen at the asylum and goods must be in accordance therewith. Where samples are required and not furnished by bidders, the articles must be equal to samples seen at the asylum, and the bids will be assumed to have been made on basis of samples. All goods must be in strict accordance with sample in original package, if possible, and delivered at the insane asylum within 20 days after contract is awarded. Bids must be in blank form, which will be furnished, together with instructions to bidders, by the clerk, upon application. Each bid on flour or meat must be accompanied by a certified check for \$300, and each bid on fish by a certified check of \$75, and all other bids by certified checks equal to 10 per cent of the amount of the bid; checks of unsuccessful bidders will be returned immediately and those accepted when the contract is completed. Bids must be enclosed in sealed envelopes and directed to the undersigned, and plainly marked on the outside, "Bids for Asylum Supplies," and the class of goods should also be inscribed on the envelope. Price, fitness and quality being equal, preference will be given to articles manufactured, grown or produced in this state. When a particular article is specifically called for, bids for other kind or manufacturer, or brand equally as good will be entertained, but to insure recognition of such bids, samples of the articles it is proposed to supply must accompany them. The board reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to accept or reject any part of a bid. Bids will be opened at the executive chambers, in the state capitol, at Salem, Oregon, at 3 p. m. on Tuesday, July 6, 1909. Auditing officers are hereby prohibited from confirming accounts of purchasers which do not comply with section 2460, chapter X, title XXIV of Beilinger and Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Oregon. BIG WEEK FOR THE SCHOOL.

St. Mary's Academy to Observe Its Golden Jubilee.

St. Mary's academy and college at Portland is making elaborate preparation for its annual commencement exercises and the golden jubilee celebration which will begin on Wednesday, June 23. The program for the various days promise to be unusually interesting and attractive.

On Wednesday evening the exercises will commence at Masonic hall, West Park and Yamhill streets, when most Rev. Alexander Christie, D. D., will deliver the address. On Thursday solemn pontifical mass will be celebrated in St. Mary's cathedral, followed by a sermon by the Right Rev. Edward J. O'Dea, D. D., of Seattle. At 1 o'clock on Thursday afternoon will be held the banquet of the clergy, and the reception of the religious sisterhoods, followed by a reception from 3 to 9 p. m. to the friends, patrons and former students, at which the alumnae members will preside as hostesses.

Friday will be given over to memorial services, with solemn requiem mass at St. Mary's at 10 o'clock, at which Right Rev. A. J. Glorieux, D. D., will be celebrant, and the sermon will be delivered by Rev. Arthur Lane. The exercises will close with solemn benediction of the sacrament at the chapel at 4 p. m. on Friday.

Already many out of town guests and former students are arriving, and the attendance promises to be a large one. Much of the music of the mass services will be rendered by the students of the school. An extensive educational exhibit illustrating the work of the institution during the past 50 years will be held at St. Mary's throughout the week, to which the public is cordially invited.

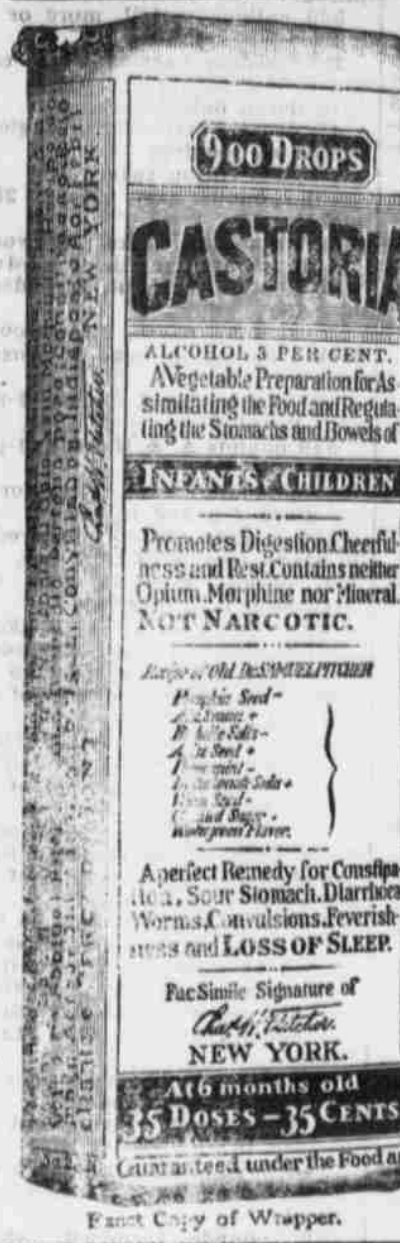
