

DIAMONDS SOLD FOR SMALL PRICE

[United Press Leased Wire.] Paris, June 25.—Louis Aucoc, the leading French diamond authority, is the new owner of the famous Hope diamond, for which the well-known collector, Habib, paid \$400,000. Aucoc purchased the gem at the sale of the Habib collection, securing it for the bargain sum of \$30,000. The Hope diamond was one of the most famous stones in Europe, and was declared by a former owner to be worth \$500,000. Seven other stones of the collection also brought much less than their supposed value, the entire collection netting but \$276,000. A 16-carat stone from the Princess Mathilda Bonaparte's casket, sold for \$32,000, while a 56-carat "mirregant" deriving its name from the similarity to the Regent of the French crown collection, brought \$60,000.

CLOUDBURST SWEEP NEBRASKA TOWN

[United Press Leased Wire.] West Point, Neb., June 25.—Followed by a cloudburst that flooded streets and many buildings, a destructive tornado swept this place early today. St. Joseph's church, Catholic, and several residences were demolished. No deaths were reported.

[United Press Leased Wire.] Berlin, June 25.—Chancellor von Beulow announced today that he will not resign because of the defeat sustained by the succession duties bill of the government's financial program in the Reichstag yesterday. The veteran statesman is undismayed by the failure of the bill to pass, and will make a determined stand for the success of the remaining measures of the program.
