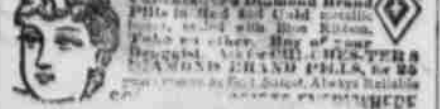

### CHINESE BOYCOTT THE PACIFIC MAIL

[United Press Leased Wire.] Hong Kong, June 28.—Boycott declared against the Pacific Mail steamship Company by Chinese merchants connected with the American trade went into effect today.

Hardships alleged to have been imposed upon Chinese passengers because of the boycott, which was decided on by a mass meeting held by 200 local merchants. These passengers' fares were not refunded, and they were compelled to pay their way back here.
