

WALLA WALLA TO RUN CIGARETTE EXCURSION

Walla Walla, Wash., June 30.—The strict enforcement of the new law prohibiting the smoking of cigarettes has been productive of much lamentation by those addicted to the habit in this city, and has resulted in an ingenious scheme to evade the watchful sheriff. This afternoon, if there is no hitch in the perfected plans of the promoters, a "cigarette excursion" will pull out of Walla Walla over the Interurban line and will cross the Oregon state line, where a supply of "paper pills of all makes, as well as plenty of the "makings" are to be provided.

The excursion idea was sprung as a joke by Al. Boglitter, of Portland, who represents a tobacco company, but so many men who hungered for a drag at the proscribed paper smoke were found who took the idea seriously that the traveling man announced his intention to really carry out the plan.

THE USUAL MURDER FOLLOWED BY SUICIDE

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Des Moines, Ia., June 30.—Run to earth by a posse, which was hot on his trail throughout the night, Cal Littlepage, a farm hand, aged 28 years, shot himself through the temple early today, rather than face a trial on a charge of double murder.

Littlepage shot and killed Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Jamison, parents of his divorced wife, yesterday afternoon. The tragedy took place at the Jamison home, eight miles west of Valley Junction. It is thought that the farm hand had accused the Jamisons of estranging him from his wife, and in a passion shot the pair for revenge.

After the murder Littlepage took flight, and was lost to sight for more than ten hours. A posse was organized and took up the chase. Early today the fugitive was found dead in a field about five miles from the scene of the murders.

The purpose of an investigating committee seems to be to prove that it isn't so.
