LITTLE TARIFF JOKER

Senator Aldrich Pleases Manufacturers of New England by Giving Them Fuel from Nova Scotia

Washington, July 3.—A feature of the coal tariff adopted by the senate that has received little attention but is likely to bring great comfort to New England manufacturers is the duty on slack. The rate fixed on the latter is 15 cents a ton, which is the next thing to free fuel.

It was not always thus. In the Dingley law no distinction was made between coal and slack and the duty on each was 67 cents a ton. In the Payne bill the Dingley rate was retained with the very important provision that coal should be admitted free from any country that admitted American coal free of duty.

Senator Aldrich struck out the reciprocal clause and recommended a duty of 60 cents a ton on coal and 15 cents a ton on slack.

It happens that slack is a subject of no interest to the householder, but constitutes the entire fuel problem for most of the manufacturers within reach of the bituminous fuel supply. Even under present conditions, because it is cheaper than coal, slack to the amount of hundreds of thousands of tons is imported by New England manufacturers from Nova Scotia. If the senate tariff bill becomes law there will be a strong additional reason for favoring it and hundreds of manufacturers now using coal will turn to slack. The price, now in its favor will be increased by the difference in the duty which will be 45 cents a ton.

This fact has not escaped the attention of the American coal producers and all possible pressure will be brought on the house conference committee to refuse to accept the senate differential.

Senator Burton of Ohio, who was most active in the efforts made in the senate to bring about acceptance of the free coal proposition of the house spoke particularly for the coal producers of Ohio and the northern part of West Virginia. They ship millions of tons of coal into the central part of Canada every year. It has been said that the Grand Trunk railway, which gets much of its fuel supply from the country, pays customs duties to the amount of \$1,000,000 a year into the Canadian treasury.

Whether Canada would accept an offer to pay this country in abolishing customs duties is a disputed question. Aldrich has said that he has information that the dominion would not accept such an offer. It needs the revenue. The exports of American coal to Canada amount to about 7,000,000 tons and the imports from Canada to the United States to about 1,500,000 tons annually.

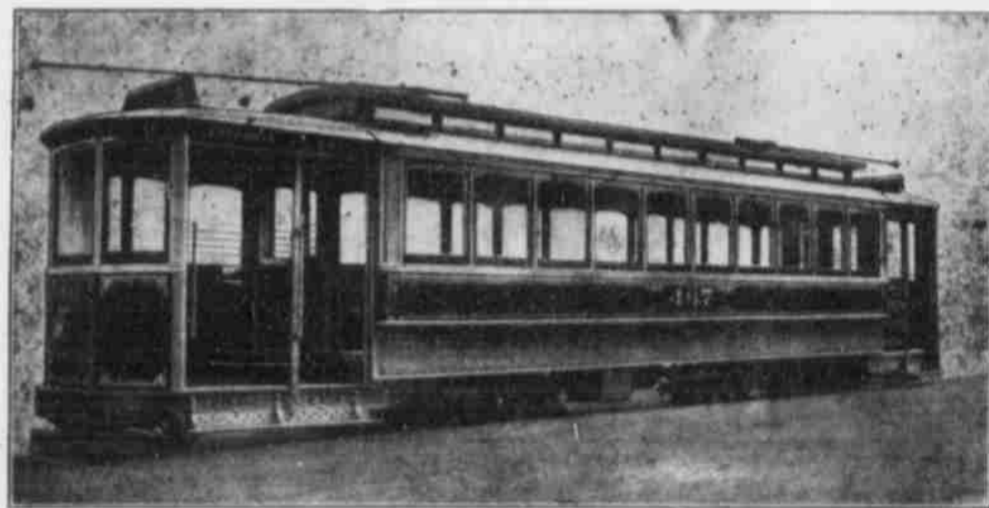
